
+ The Candle Of Hope



2 Corinthians 4:5-6 ⁵ For we do not proclaim ourselves; we proclaim Jesus Christ as Lord and ourselves as your slaves for Jesus's sake. ⁶ For it is the God who said, "Light will shine out of darkness," who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Christ. Today, I will speak on two themes, one directly from the Readings and the second from our Statement of Purpose.

1- the Readings.

The readings during the Season of Lent review the Covenants. Last week, the Covenant with Noah and all of creation. Today, we have the covenant with Abraham and the importance of sacrifice underscored.

You may ask, what kind of God would ever require the sacrifice of a child to appease the God? The answer is Elohim, the Hebrew word for God, Gods, Goddess, Goddesses, the great ones that appear 2,340 times in the Hebrew Testament, and that word is rendered as God in our English Bibles. The Divine of all creation has the authority to create, birth, destroy, and bring death upon anything in creation. Divine authority is a fact of creation.

Japan confronted God's reality of design on January 19, 2024, when its lunar lander ended its journey to the Moon upside down. Again, there must be something scientists are not comprehending just yet that caused the upside-down landing. (source: https://www.space.com/japan-slim-moon-lander-awake-after-hibernation) I bring up these two lunar landings to emphasize the point that Scientists are attempting to understand what the Divine has put into place and how to do various things with that Divine reality of design, be it on Earth, in the atmosphere, outer space, or on any other collection of matter or gasses anywhere in the Universe. We are attempting to discover what is already there. So, the Divine that has put all of this in place maintains the authority over all of it and over us, from birth to death, before and after our death. Our acceptance or decision not to accept God's reality design does not change that design. We only live and move and have our being within it. (Acts 17:28)

In today's first reading, Abraham accepted God's place, even to require Abraham to sacrifice his son. What a test of trust to be asked to sacrifice one's child. There are verses in this story that were left out of the lectionary today in the interest of time. Two of the verses are essential, in my opinion. Abraham knew that God would intervene somehow. In verses 4 and 5, we read: ⁴ On the third day, Abraham looked up and saw the place far away. ⁵ Then Abraham said to his young men, "Stay here with the donkey; the boy and I will go over there; we will worship, and then we will come back to you."

Abraham knew somehow that he and his son would come back. There is much more on this than time permits today. Ultimately, God does what The Angel Of The Lord stopped Abraham from doing, namely, God sacrifices the Only Begotten Son of God for our sins. God so loved us that God did the sacrifice for our sins.

Psalm 116 is the voice of Abraham and every other human as we struggle to maintain our faith in all of life's circumstances.

I kept my faith, even when I said,

"I am greatly afflicted;"

Precious in the sight of the LORD

is the death of his faithful ones.

How is the death of the faithful one precious? By our faith and trust in God, our death will lead to our resurrection to eternal life. This is God's design; all we can do is try to understand it and then move, live, and breathe within it.

In the second reading, Romans 4:13-25 we have it confirmed: Abraham's dispensation was of promise. "¹³ For the promise that he would inherit the world did not come to Abraham or to his descendants through the law but through the righteousness of faith." We are all children of Abraham: Romans 4:16, 17 ¹⁶ For this reason the promise depends on faith, in order that it may rest on grace, so that it may be guaranteed to all his descendants, not only to the adherents of the law but also to those who share the faith of Abraham (who is the father of all of us, ¹⁷ as it is written, "I have made you the father of many nations"), in the presence of the God in whom he believed, [a] who gives life to the dead and calls into existence the things that do not exist."

, ²¹ being fully convinced that God was able to do what he had promised. ²² Therefore "it was reckoned to him as

2-25-24 Lent Week 2, Black History Month Week 4, Year B Page 23 of 40 righteousness." ²³ Now the words, "it was reckoned to him," were written not for his sake alone ²⁴ but for ours also. <u>It will be reckoned to us who believe^[c] in him who raised Jesus our Lord from the dead, ²⁵ who was handed over for our trespasses and was raised for our justification.</u>

Jesus: Mark 8:36-38 "³⁶ For what will it profit them to gain the whole world and forfeit their life? ³⁷ Indeed, what can they give in return for their life? ³⁸ Those who are ashamed of me and of my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of them the Son of Man will also be ashamed when he comes in the glory of his Father with the holy angels."

This is God's design; this is God's plan. It is our place to study, accept, and live it.

Accepting, studying, and living out God's plan is what brings me to the second point today: putting this understanding into action.

2) The direct application of putting our understanding of faith into action is often played out in our politics here in the United States. Politics and religion are often tightly intertwined all over the world.

We are in a Presidential Election year. In addition to the Office of the President of the United States, 468 seats in the United States Congress (33 in the Senate and 435 in the House of Representatives) are also up for election in November 2024. (source:

https://ballotpedia.org/United_States_Congress_elections, 2024) The real power for lawmaking at the Federal level is in the Congress. The Senators and Representatives are expected to bring the opinions and standards of their local region to the decision-making process in our United States Capital, and thereby, we hope to have an authentic temperature of the views and desires of the people. The party in the majority also has a lot of leverage to make decisions that could impact social life for many years ahead. One area the majority party has power over is the appointment of Federal Judges and Supreme Court Judges. The Constitution of the United States assigns lifetime appointments to Federal and Supreme Court Judges. If the majority party falls into patterns of governing by the ideology of some constituents rather than the established principles outlined in our Constitution and other governing

documents, we could face the risk of unraveling our democratic process. Gubernatorial elections are also being held in eleven states and two territories in November of this year, 2024. Finally, there are numerous state and local elections, including nine lieutenant gubernatorial seats, ten attorney general seats, and seven secretary of state seats. There are many more down-ballot seats up for election in 2024. (source:

Just for a moment, pause, and in your mind, imagine and consider the number of people who will be elected into office all across the United States of America this November 2024. There are two reasons I am bringing this up. First, many people mistakenly think the only election that matters is who "wins" the presidency. Very soon, we will hear two, possibly three names over and over concerning who will "win" the election. It seems that we hear very little about most the other seats being filled or even who is running to fill them; which leads to my second point.

Secondly, an ideology that presents as "Christian" and "American" is attempting to overtake our political system. This ideology is not new and has roots as deep as the initial explorers who "discovered" this continent and established a new country for God. According to some writers, it was established particularly as Christian.

Critical to understanding this ideology is to remember you have heard me say all theological systems appear to grow out of the view taken of the final events of the Bible, the eschaton, called the field of Eschatology. The prominent schools of eschatology are Spiritual, Amillennial, Postmillenial, and Premillennial. The Postmillennial school is fueling the current self-named conservative right-wing political agenda. I used to think many of this system's leaders, who have gained tremendous strength since the late 1960s and 1970s, were unaware of the eschatology that was shaping just about their entire political agenda. However, in the last ten or so years, these leaders have been speaking their "truth to power." While I have yet to hear any politician say the term postmillennialism, they do talk about dominion, theocratic, Christian nation-building. The ever-growing increase of elected officials who ascribe to this ideology is the reason I am talking openly about this today because there is

no daylight between politics and religion with postmillennialists. The popular contemporary secular name for the Postmillennial theological system is Christian Nationalism. The definition provided by Wikipedia is precisely interchangeable with the definition of postmillennialism. From Wikipedia:

Christian nationalism is a type of *religious nationalism* that is affiliated with *Christianity*. It primarily focuses on the internal politics of society, such as legislating *civil* and *criminal* laws that reflect their view of Christianity and the role of religion/s in political and social life.^[1]
