Today we consider the seventh church, Laodicea-Apostate church ** the lukewarm church **(A.D. 1900- to the Tribulation) pages 84 - 91

The Tradition of the Elders

7 Now when the Pharisees and some of the scribes who had come from Jerusalem gathered around Jesus, 2 they noticed some were eating with defiled hands, that is, without washing them. 3 (For the Pharisees, and all the Jews, do not eat unless they thoroughly wash their hands, thus observing the tradition of the elders; 4 and they do not eat anything from the market unless they wash it and there are also many other traditions that they observe, the washing of cups, pots, and bronze kettles.) 5 So the

Pharisees and the scribes asked him, “Why do your disciples not follow the tradition of the elders, but eat with defiled hands?”

6 Jesus answered, “Isaiah prophesied rightly about you hypocrites, as it is written,

¹⁴ Then he called the crowd again and said to them, “Listen to me, all of you, and understand: 15 there is nothing outside a person that by going in can defile, but the things that come out are what defile.”

Mark 7:2,3 2 they noticed some were eating with defiled hands, that is, without washing them. 3 (For the Pharisees, and all the Jews, do not eat unless they thoroughly wash their hands, thus observing the tradition of the elders; 4 and they do not eat anything from the market unless they wash it and there are also many other traditions that they observe, the washing of cups, pots, and bronze kettles.)

It is interesting to be thinking about handwashing with our current situation with COVID-19+.

When Teachings, Dogmas, and Practices replace Doctrines:

6 Jesus answered, "Isaiah prophesied rightly about you hypocrites, as it is written,

'These things says the Amen, the Faithful and True Witness, the Beginning of the creation of God: ¹⁵ "I know your works, that you are neither cold nor hot. I could wish you were cold or hot. ¹⁶ So then, because you are lukewarm, and neither cold nor hot, I will vomit you out of My mouth. ¹⁷ Because you say, 'I am rich, have become wealthy, and have need of nothing'—and do not know that you are wretched, miserable, poor, blind, and naked— ¹⁸ I counsel you to buy from Me gold refined in the fire, that you may be rich; and white garments, that you may be clothed, *that* the shame of your nakedness may not be revealed; and anoint your eyes with eye salve, that you may see. ¹⁹ As many as I love, I rebuke and chasten. Therefore be zealous and repent. ²⁰ Behold, I stand at the door and knock. + Sermon: Series: The state of the Church according to the seven letters to the seven churches in the Book of Revelation

"In the Revelation, Christ discloses the course of the life of the Church to her perfection at the end (BEDE). Writing to seven churches, John is in fact writing to all churches and to all ages, for the number seven represents the present life (APRINGIUS, ANDREW OF CAESAREA)."

PERTAINING TO ALL THE CHURCHES. APRINGIUS OF BEJA: What is the importance of the people of Asia that they alone deserve to receive the apostolic revelation? However, there is a mystery in the number and a sacrament in the name of the province. First, let us discuss the meaning of the number, because both the number six and the number seven are always used in the law with a mystical meaning: "For God made heaven and earth in six days," and "on the seventh day he rested from his works" ⁸ and "on it," it says, "they shall enter again into my rest." The number seven, therefore, signifies the period of the present life, so that the apostle is not merely writing to seven churches and to that world in which he was then present, but it is understood that he is giving

these writings to all future ages, even to the consummation of the world. Therefore, he mentions the number in a most holy manner, and he names "Asia," which means "elevated" or "walking," indicating that celestial fatherland which we call the "catholic church." For exalted by the Lord and always moving toward the things which are above, it is the Church which advances by spiritual exercises and is always desirous of the things of heaven. TRACTATE ON THE APOCALYPSE 1:4.¹

6. Philadelphia-Missionary church (A.D. 1750-1900 to the rapture) pages 78 – 83 ** the small but faithful church.**

In this study of the seven letters, we will make a chart that has four parts:

- A) Commendation: What Christ approves about this Church.
- B) Condemnation: What Christ disapproves about this Church.
- C) Counsel: What Christ suggests to this Church.
- D) Challenge: What Christ offers to those who accept the instruction and act upon it.

We will review the seven stages of the Church as **cumulative, qualitative, and quantitative**. Each stage is cumulative or incremental as it builds in succession on the previous stage and continues forward. Each stage is qualitative as we measure the qualities (good, bad, or indifferent). Finally, each stage is quantitative as we measure the growth or decline of the actual population of persons in each stage of the Church. Notice many of these characteristics of each stage of the Church's story continue to the present day. When the study is over, we will look at the chart and use it as a starting place for our self-evaluation to improve and celebrate our successes.

As I present this series, it will be from three perspectives.

There is the **historical perspective** – who, what, where, when, and why. The **prophetic perspective** – what prophecy is here, was some of it or all of it fulfilled by now, and is some of it or all of it to be fulfilled in the future.

Thirdly, the **spiritual perspective** – what universal lessons are revealed and how they might be applied in our present lives.

Again, any treatment of these issues in this short sermon is an immeasurable understatement of the essential facts.

Introduction to part 8

1) Historical Background: The city of Laodicea evolved into a very wealthy city from an insignificant and poor start. One main contributing factor to it becoming a wealthy city was its position on a major trade route. Laodicea was 11 miles west of Colossae, 6.2 miles south of Hierapolis, about 99 miles east of Ephesus. As the Roman Republic was ending it became one of the most important commercial cities in Asia Minor. There were large money transactions, and a flourishing black wool trade was one of the most successful businesses. The city advanced the arts, education, sciences and had a great medical school.

Laodicea had an extensive Jewish community, and it seems to have had a significant and wealthy Christian community. While there are excavations that indicate three early churches existed, and while there is a record of a bishopric from very early years, very little is known of this congregation's work to spread the Gospel. It appears to have existed as one organization among others in this cultural center, the City of Laodicea.

LaHaye makes a point of observation that the first three churches end when a new one starts. Ephesus ended, and Smyrna began. Smyrna ended, and Pergamum began. Pergamum ended, and Thyatira began. The last four churches on the chart are all still with us, Thyatira, Sardis, Philadelphia, and now Laodicea. "Thus Laodicea adds to this church age by arising from the three that preceded it. The Laodicean church age began around 1900 and is increasing in intensity at a breathtaking pace." (Revelation Unveiled, pg. 85)

Currently, we find ourselves surrounded by the lukewarm church. Perhaps some people are tired and worn out by the stress of our society. Others are seeing the old and established ways of being church are not working, but there doesn't seem to be any youth to lead the way into new ideas. Change is too much to deal with when it comes to my church and my religion. Some, many, just think it is best to let things simply die out and fade out, after all, I won't be here in 20 years anyway, so why should I care?

2) Rev 3:14 ¹⁴ "And to the angel of the church in Laodicea write,

'These things says the Amen, the Faithful and True Witness, the Beginning of the creation of God:

As in other introductory sentences to each of the churches, Jesus gives a self-revelation in four characteristics. Jesus is

The Amen – The final word, the confirmation of God. God's total revelation of God's self is made known in Jesus. Christ is "image of the invisible God...." "It pleased God that in Christ all the fullness of God should dwell." (Colossians 1:15+,19)

The Faithful and True Witness – In Revelation 21:5 Jesus says, "Write these things, for these words are faithful and true." When Christ comes to cleanse the earth of the Anti-christ armies and rule on the earth, Jesus rides a white horse. "11 Now I saw heaven opened, and behold, a white horse. And He who sat on him was called Faithful and True, and in righteousness, He judges and makes war. " (Revelation 19:11)

The Beginning of the creation of God: – John 1:1 In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ² He was in the beginning with God. ³ All things were made through Him, and without Him nothing was made that was made.

Colossians 1:16-17 ¹⁶ For by Him all things were created that are in heaven and that are on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or ^[a]principalities or ^[b]powers. All things were created through Him and for Him. ¹⁷ And He is before all things, and in Him all things consist.

A) Commendation: What Christ approves about this Church.

The Church of Laodicea has the unique distinction of being the only church of the seven stages to not have one single word of commendation. The lukewarm church is so objectionable to Christ that there is not one word to commend her with.

B) Condemnation: What Christ disapproves about this Church.

3) Rev. 3:15 ¹⁵ “I know your works, that you are neither cold nor hot. I could wish you were cold or hot.

The last days church would have a neutral condition, not zealous of good works, it would be lifeless and indifferent, “lukewarm.” There may be a lot of organization, programs, committees, activities, but no spiritual power. Even repetitive schedule and liturgy, no creativity. More programming, planning, but little praying. 2 Timothy 3:5 “having the form of godliness but denying its power. Do not associate with them.”

4) Rev. 3:16 ¹⁶ So then, because you are lukewarm, and neither cold nor hot, I will vomit you out of My mouth.

The Lord does not claim ownership over this church. Instead, he rejects it. This church will be left behind at the Blessed Hope and will march full-on into the Tribulation Period. It will also be vulnerable to the leadership of the “false prophet” of the “anti-christ” of the seven-year Tribulation Period because the membership has a very minimal understanding of Scripture, prophecy, and Theology.

5) Rev. 3:16 ¹⁷ Because you say, ‘I am rich, have become wealthy, and have need of nothing’—and do not know that you are wretched, miserable, poor, blind, and naked—

The wealth and the public position of respect, the outward appearance of holiness and religiosity, the clericalism, the life of the religionist has caused this church to think it has arrived. What it does not notice is the slow death that is happening. For example, the absence of interest in Bible education of the youth, the young adult, the seasoned adult, the elderly.

Amos 8:11-13 ¹¹ “Behold, the days are coming,” says the Lord GOD,

“That I will send a famine on the land,
Not a famine of bread,
Nor a thirst for water,

But of hearing the words of the LORD.

¹² They shall wander from sea to sea,

And from north to east;

They shall run to and fro, seeking the word of the LORD,

But shall not find *it*.

¹³ “In that day the fair virgins

And strong young men

Shall faint from thirst.

This is my own association. I often think about this as I try to interest people in study of the Word. I think about this famine when I try to engage people in the Vocational Ministry Training Program. I think about this famine when I see the paint peeling on the building, when I see the foundation in need of attention, when I see the drywall falling down upstairs, when I see pipes leaking, boards cracking. Complacency will lead to tragedy. Complacency can lead to massive failure. A church that keeps doing what it always has done and is satisfied with a quiet sense of pleasure and security will often be accompanied by a lack of awareness of potential dangers, potential system failures, equipment that needs to be replaced, shrinking membership.

Ray Of Hope Church teaching ministry disagrees with Tim LaHaye here: “Instead of grappling with and teaching the truth of the Bible, they spend their time in social causes. The Laodicean church today would be at the forefront of the gay rights and feminist movements and be leaders in the ordination of women and the feminizing of the deity. The message of our Lord is clear to such a church: ‘Have nothing to do with them.’”

LaHaye, Tim. Revelation Unveiled (p. 87). Zondervan. Kindle Edition.

Tim LaHaye is raising teachings to the level of Doctrines with these statements. This was entirely too wide of a brush to put all of these teachings on one category. Our Statement Of Purpose calls us to support many of these issues Mr. LaHaye takes exception to.

C) Counsel: What Christ suggests to this Church.

6) Rev. 3:18a¹⁸ I counsel you to buy from Me gold refined in the fire, that you may be rich;

Material riches are not everlasting and usually not spiritual. The riches that are for eternal life come from the Blood of Jesus Christ, the Sacraments, and first of all our faith. 1 Peter 1:7 indicates our faith is “more precious than gold.” Notice the poor church is asked to buy gold. That seems a little odd until we recall Isaiah 55:1 where we are invited to come and buy “without money and without price.” We remember here the song, “Come To The Water.”

7) Rev. 3:18b buy from me white garments, that you may be clothed, *that* the shame of your nakedness may not be revealed;

Due the loss of spiritual authority, the lukewarm church is naked spiritually. Only the covering of the righteousness of Christ will help. Isaiah 61:10 God provides “garments of salvation” “robe of righteousness” so we are prepared when called.

8) Rev. 3:18c and anoint your eyes with eye salve, that you may see.

We need the inspiration and illumination of the Holy Spirit to see the way of God. We need the Holy Spirit to live within us to discern the will of God and to see the path to follow it. If we do not have the Holy Spirit within us the ways of God are unacceptable to our minds. If we have the Holy Spirit within us, we accept the Holy Spirit's direction and our eyes are healed. (see 1 Cor. 2:14)

9) Rev. 3:19a¹⁹ As many as I love, I rebuke and chasten.

If we are going to get out of our lukewarm state then we should expect the Lord to guide us with some nudges and some hard hits and bumps to help us wake up and change our direction. The Lord is a living and truly present God. He disciplines and guides us with strength and intentional action.

10) Rev. 3:19b Therefore be zealous and repent.

Return to the first love. Be on fire for the Lord. Be eager to do

discern, understand and do the Lord's will. Come out of complacency and turn away from the easy road. Fire up and start your engines and begin anew.

D) Challenge: What Christ offers to those who accept the instruction and act upon it.

11) Rev. 3:20 ²⁰ Behold, I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears My voice and opens the door, I will come in and dine with them, and they with Me.

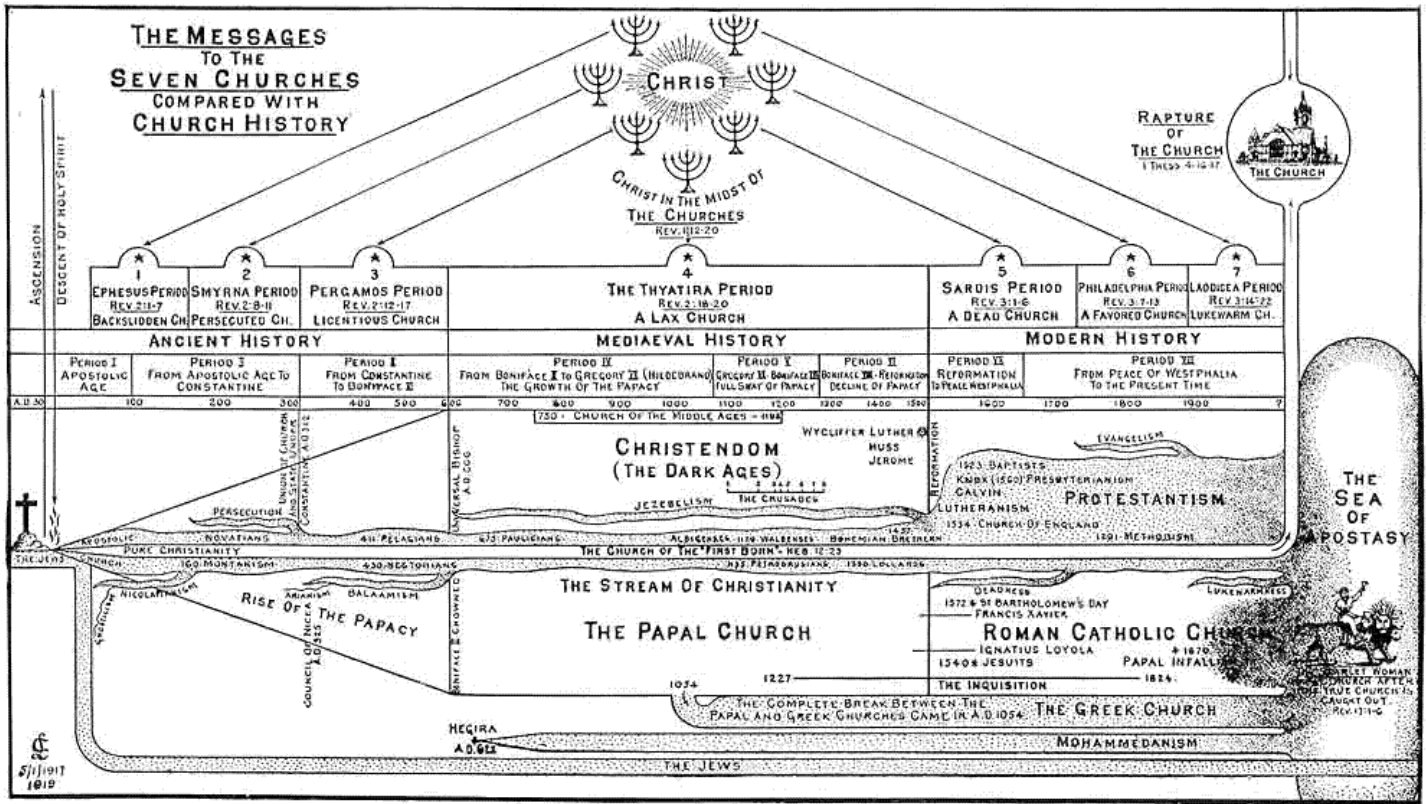
This verse has been the subject of many paintings where we see Jesus standing at a door that does not have a handle on the outside. He stands there and knocks and waits to be let in. Once He is invited in there is a Holy Communion, a Holy Union, a Common – Union with the person or persons who have opened the door to Him.

12) Rev. 3:21²¹ To the ones who overcome I will grant to sit with Me on My throne, as I also overcame and sat down with My Father on God's throne.

“Through Him, with Him, and in Him”

13) Rev. 3:22 "He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches."

The Spirit has just told you what the Holy Spirit has been saying this entire age, listen, understand, and follow to the faithful conclusion of this way of life, the Paradise of God. We can do this!



Climate Change today and tomorrow.

In Revelation 16:8-9 we read the Fourth Bowl Judgment will bring scorching heat of the sun. Here is the text: Fourth Bowl: Men Are Scorched

⁸ Then the fourth angel poured out his bowl on the sun, and power was given to him to scorch men with fire. ⁹ And men were scorched with great heat, and they blasphemed the name of God who has power over these plagues; and they did not repent and give Him glory.

During the last third, roughly, of the seven-year Tribulation Period God will authorize the seven bowl judgments. When the fourth bowl is poured out on the Anti-Christ's kingdom people will contend with a heat wave from the sun as never before experienced. People will not be able to go outside as their skin will be scorched "with fire" (verse 8). Keep in mind this judgment is falling on those who are blaspheming God and following the rule of the Anti-Christ. Believers will be kept safe from all of these judgments.

Years ago I was laughed out of apartment where I was teaching this portion of the Book of Revelation. Friends and Members of Ray Of Hope said this is never going to happen because Science shows the climate would never become that hot. That was in the year 1994. This is twenty-seven years later and we are facing a much warmer experience of our climate .

John 16:7

Did you realize the Holy Spirit is with you to bring you all those actions of God? If we understand the Real Presence of God is with us in Christ through the powerful ministry of the Holy Spirit, we will experience more confidence, love of ourselves and our neighbors, and be able to feel better about our lived experience.

WHO SHOULD RECEIVE HOLY COMMUNION, THE EUCHARIST, AT RAY OF HOPE CHURCH?

Everyone is invited to receive Holy Communion, also known as The Eucharist, The Lord's Table, or The Blessed Sacrament at Ray Of Hope Church Of Our Lord Jesus Christ, Inc.

It is not required that you be a member of this Church or any other church, to receive Holy Communion at / or with Ray Of Hope Church.

This Holy Communion is the Table of Jesus Christ, who is really present among us. Jesus invites you to receive Him in this Eucharistic banquet. If this is your first time receiving The Blessed Sacrament, let us know before you receive or right after, so we might pray a special prayer of thanksgiving with you.

Unfortunately, through the centuries many institutional churches have established rules, teachings, and practices that would exclude people from Holy Communion. There has been an almost endless list of reasons to exclude people from the Blessed Sacrament. Yet, together, during the worship service, we recite the very words of Jesus, the Words of Institution, "This is my body. This is my blood," and we rehear Christ present with us saying: "Take this, all of you and eat; Take this all of you and drink" of this gift.

I have thought about this extensively and have decided to take these words "Take this, all of you.." as a command to the Church to give, and bring, the Eucharistic Gift to everyone who will receive. This approach also requires us to teach people about this gift. I have stated in other places, **it is uniquely and deliberately the work of Christ in His Church** to offer the

necessary education, guidance, and practices that help people live a life centered and purposed on finding and sharing the Will of God. The Lord's Table is central in that life.

The Eucharist belongs to the Church. The Blessed Sacrament is Christ in us, through us, and with us; made known in the breaking of the Bread of Life and drinking of the Cup of Salvation. We are to take this gift to the whole world.

We begin by inviting those who are on the fringe of society, those who have been pushed aside, those who are poor, who are not accepted, who are sick, who need God's help in special ways. We welcome and bring the Eucharist to everyone who has been told they cannot receive it by other Denominations. In conclusion, to all persons who have ever been told "no you cannot" go to Communion in any other church, hear us, "yes you can" at Ray Of Hope. All are welcome. Or as we like to say as one of our mottos, when we quote Fr. Bartholomew J. O'Brien; "You are as welcome here as Christ Himself."

Dear Friend,

Last month the House passed the [Equality Act \(H.R. 5\)](#). For those unaware, this important legislation would amend existing civil rights laws, such as the *Civil Rights Act of 1964*, to include sexual orientation, and gender identity as protected characteristics under law. The bill also expands federal non-discrimination protections regarding discrimination based on race, color, national origin, **Religion**, sex, sexual orientation or gender identity in public settings, and protects against sex-based discrimination in government services and federally-funded programs.

This week, the Senate held its first ever hearing on the [Equality Act](#) and as expected, the debate was heated. It seems opponents of the bill (Senate Republicans) are promoting [several misconceptions](#) about its purpose and scope which include:

- *"The Equality Act would destroy religious freedom in this country."*
 - **NOT TRUE.** Freedom of Religion is already protected by the First Amendment of the U.S. Constitution. Nothing in the *Equality Act* would change that. The bill simply extends those rights that most vulnerable groups are already afforded to those who have been denied them, such as the **LGBTQ community**. In fact, the bill actually protects freedom of Religion by preventing the imposing of one's Religion upon another.
- *"The Equality Act will make athletics unfair for females."*
 - **NOT TRUE.** Schools across the nation already have policies in place to ensure a level playing field for all students, and they are working. Additionally, except for a very small percentage, most students who participate in high school sports do not continue on with their athletic endeavours after high school. The possibility that perhaps one or two transgender students in

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an entire student body would ruin that opportunity for another is almost nonexistent. *Little IX* is extremely important in regards to girls athletics, and the bottom line is that **nothing in the Equality Act changes that**. Instead, we should be calling for increased funding for girls athletics.

- "The Equality Act will allow men to harass women in public restrooms."
 - **NOT TRUE**. We already have laws in place to prevent such acts, and the *Equality Act* does nothing to change that. Additionally, **21 states** have had similar nondiscrimination laws on the books for decades now and they have worked, as there have been no increases in public safety incidents in bathrooms since they were codified.

We must always push back against these false narratives whenever they are presented. 
