

World Communion Sunday is a celebration observed by several <u>Christian denominations</u>, taking place on the first Sunday of every October, that promotes Christian unity and <u>ecumenical</u> cooperation.^[11] It focuses on an observance of the <u>eucharist</u>. The tradition was begun in 1933 by Hugh Thomson Kerr who ministered in the <u>Shadyside Presbyterian Church</u>. According to *Presbyterian Outlook*:

Davitt S. Bell (the late Clerk of Session and church historian at Shadyside) recalled that Dr. Kerr first conceived the notion of World Communion Sunday during his year as moderator of the General Assembly (1930). Dr. Kerr's younger son, the Rev. Dr. Donald Craig Kerr, who is pastor emeritus of the Roland Park 10-1-23 corrected World Communion Year A Page 19 of 49 Presbyterian Church in Baltimore, was sixteen in 1933. He has related that World Communion Sunday grew out of the Division of Stewardship at Shadyside. It was their attempt to bring churches together in a service of Christian unity—in which everyone might receive both inspiration and information, and above all, to know how important the Church of Jesus Christ is, and how each congregation is interconnected one with another.^[2]

It was then adopted throughout the <u>US Presbyterian Church</u> in 1936^[1] and subsequently spread to other denominations. In 1940, the <u>Federal Council of Churches</u> (now the <u>National Council of</u> <u>Churches</u>), led by <u>Jesse Moren Bader</u>, endorsed World Communion Sunday and began to promote it to Christian churches worldwide.^[1]

The title "Bread From Heaven" comes from this reading.

Exodus 16:4 ⁴ Then the LORD said to Moses, "I am going to rain bread from heaven for you, and each day the people shall go out and gather enough for that day.

What work are you performing? ³¹ Our ancestors ate the manna in the wilderness, as it is written, 'He gave them bread from heaven to eat.' "³² Then Jesus said to them, "Very truly, I tell you, it was not Moses who gave you the bread from heaven, but it is my Father who gives you the true bread from heaven. ³³ For the bread of God is that which^[a] comes down from heaven and gives life to the world."

Therefore, the Manna that God gave to the believer's in the desert was a foretaste of the "True Bread From Heaven" a new bread that Jesus would give in His own Name, no longer in the name of Moses. This New and eternal Bread From Heaven would give eternal life to anyone who ate of it. This, Jesus said, is the True Bread from Heaven.



Francis Bernardone, the son of a prosperous cloth merchant, was born in 1182 in the small mountain city of Assisi, Italy. Loved by his parents and given material privileges, he grew up idealistic, self-confident, and a leader among his teen-age companions. He could always be counted on for joining in the fun and revelry that occurred nightly in the streets of Assisi.

Soon, however, it became apparent that God was calling Francis to a way of life different from that of his companions. With hopes of knighthood dashed after becoming ill as a prisoner of war in neighboring Perugia, Francis looked for direction for his life.

After a time, he realized God was calling him to "rebuild my church" and that his life was to be lived as one of God's "poor ones," sharing what he had with the lepers who were so numerous outside the city and touching people from all



walks of life.

Francis would have loved World Communion Sunday because Francis was disturbed by the divisions that were prominent in his day. The most significant one being the wealthy and the working poor. The Church itself was divided between East and West for over 100 years by the time he was an adult. If he was alive today he would welcome a celebration where potentially the Western Church could set aside her 33,000 + denominations for a day and recognize the Body Of Christ extends to all points on the Earth.

Today we have new sad divisions that are even threatening the wellbeing of some of our denominations. We can look to Francis and hear his voice calling us to set aside our divisions and focus on the worship of God, in Christ, through the powerful ministry of the Holy Spirit.

St. Francis and the Gospel

Francis loved the Gospel. He once told the brothers and sisters who were following his example that the only rule of life they needed was the Gospel. Francis openly taught and discussed the Gospel with anyone, of any class or status in life. He saw in the reading of the Gospel Christ becoming truly present

So as we hear the Gospel now, let us receive it with burning hearts resolved to follow Christ with a radical yes.

St. Francis and the Eucharist Francis recognized the Body Of Christ in every person. He realized that all of us are an inseperable part of the living God, the Body Of Christ in the world. Again, he saw no divisions or distinctions in the Body of Christ. In fact, as already noted, he called the church back to celebration of all of creation.

Women followed Francis from the very beginning. The leader of the women was Clare of Assisi.

Clare had a very special devotion to Christ present in the Blessed Sacrament, Holy Communion.

In fact one night when invaders were climbing the walls of the convent with the intention of violating the women, Clare ran to the place where the Holy Communion bread was stored, she placed it in the vessel to show it and as she walked on the top of the walls of the convent where the men were climbing up the side. All of the invading men were supernaturally pushed to the ground by the Holy Spirit. For this reason artists often depict Clare of Assisi holding the monstrance, the vessel to show the Holy.



WHO SHOULD RECEIVE HOLY COMMUNION, THE EUCHARIST, AT RAY OF HOPE CHURCH?

Everyone may receive Holy Communion, also known as The Eucharist, The Lord's Table, or The Blessed Sacrament at Ray Of Hope Church Of Our Lord Jesus Christ, Inc.

You are not required to be a member of this Church or any other church to receive Holy Communion at / or with Ray Of Hope Church.

This Holy Communion is the Table of Jesus Christ, who is present among us. Jesus invites you to receive Him in this Eucharistic banquet. If this is your first time receiving The Blessed Sacrament, let us know before you receive it, or right after so we might pray a special prayer of thanksgiving with you.

Unfortunately, through the centuries, many institutional churches have established rules, teachings, and practices that exclude people from Holy Communion. There has been an almost endless list of reasons to exclude people from the Blessed Sacrament. Yet, together, during the worship service, we recite the very words of Jesus, the Words of Institution, "This is my body. This is my blood," and we rehear Christ present with us saying: "Take this, all of you and eat; Take this all of you and drink" of this gift.

After extensive consideration, I take these words, "Take this, all of you.." as a command to the Church to give and bring the Eucharistic Gift to everyone who will receive. This approach also requires us to educate people about this gift. I have said it is **uniquely and deliberately the work of Christ in His Church** to offer the necessary education, guidance, and practices that help people live a life centered and purposed on finding and sharing the Will of God. The Lord's Table is central to that life.

The Eucharist belongs to the Church. The Blessed Sacrament is Christ in, through, with us, and made known in breaking the Bread of Life and drinking the Cup of Salvation. We are to take this gift to the whole World.

We begin by inviting those on the fringe of Society, those pushed aside, poor, not accepted, sick, and who need God's help in extraordinary ways.

We welcome and bring the Eucharist to everyone told they cannot receive it by other Denominations. In conclusion, to everyone told

"no, you cannot" go to Communion in any other church; hear us, "yes, you can" at Ray Of Hope. All are welcome. Or, as we like to say as one of our mottos when we quote Fr. Bartholomew J. O'Brien, "You are as welcome here as Christ Himself."
