Bell's 1st ring. As our bell rings, please find your seat and pray silently for the next few minutes. Please refrain from conversations as these disturb those trying to pray.

Our St. Francis and St. Clare of Assisi bell at Ray Of Hope Church, 380 W. 1st St. in Elmira, NY, is a gift from Michael Quinnell of Syracuse, NY, given in September 2005. The bell rings out 39 joyful rings, in contrast to tolling the bell in single rings. The 39 joyful rings honor the 39 lashes Jesus endured, and we now celebrate victory and gratitude for our Salvation. "The chastisement for our peace was upon Him, And by His stripes, we are healed." (Isaiah 53:5) We ring the bell before worship and Bible Enrichment sessions. Listen carefully and see if you can hear all 39 rings.

We have this artistic statue of St. Francis by our door to remind us that when coming in and going out, we should always welcome everyone, just as Christ has welcomed us, as we recite from Romans 15:7.

+ The Candle Of Hope

Today, we light our Candle Of Hope to celebrate our Faith and trust in the promised "Blessed Hope," also known as "The Rapture," the return of Christ who will transform the living faithful and raise all to new life. Those viewing at home may light a special candle and bring it to your table. Now, everyone, please join me and recite these words of Jesus to celebrate the Truth they promise us. Jesus said: (John 5:25 and Titus 2:13)

ALL: "I am the resurrection and the life. Those who believe in me, even though they die, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die." (John 11:25, 26)

As we celebrate the life of Saint Francis of Assisi, we will listen to some of his stories here in our worship this morning.

+ First Reading

Francis was born on September 26, 1182. St Francis died at the Portiuncula, (more information here https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Portiuncula) Italy, late at night on October 3, 1226; some say it was early morning, October 4. His Feast Day is October 4, the day he entered Paradise..

Francis Bernardone was the son of a prosperous cloth merchant in the small mountain city of Assisi, Italy. He was loved by his parents and given material privileges, and he grew up idealistic, self-confident, and a leader among his teenage companions. He could always be counted on to join in the nightly fun and revelry in the streets of Assisi.


When he became a teen, it became apparent that God was calling Francis to a way of life different from that of his companions. All the families of privilege of Assisi would send their sons off to war as knights. Family pride among the wealthy of Assisi was a source of competition among families that often expanded generations. So, he became a knight, much to his father's pride. However, the glories of knighthood were soon dashed after becoming ill as a prisoner of war in neighboring Perugia and sent home to the shame of himself, his family, and the townspeople. Francis had a long period of illness and

After a time, he realized God was calling him to complete dedication. One day in the year 1205, when he was 23 years old while wandering through the fields, he came to a little chapel in ruins named San Damiano, which translates Saint Damian, possibly in honor of Saints Cosmas and Damian, third-century Arabian-born twin brothers who embraced Christianity and practiced medicine and surgery without a fee (source:

https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Saints_Cosmas_and_Damian_) or, since the building San Damiano was originally a Benedictine priory (https://www.umbriatourism.it/en/-/the-church-of-san-damiano) with records back to 1030, the church may be named after St. Peter Damian, a Benedictine who lived from 1007 - 1072 and was a Bishop and Doctor of the Church (https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Peter_Damian). Inside what remained of the chapel was the very Cross you see in the picture below. It is a work of art and is filled with symbolism. While praying, Francis clearly heard within himself Jesus saying, "Francis, rebuild my church." Sure of the command he and some of his friends set out to actually rebuild the chapel. The rebuilding effort and so many others joining in the effort led to a complete conversion and decision that his life was to be lived as one of God's "poor ones," sharing what he had with the lepers who were so numerous outside the City and touching people from all walks of life. Francis welcomed everyone.

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SAN DAMIANO CRUCIFIX THE CROSS THATY SPOKE TO SAINT FRANCIS

The large figure of Christ dominates the painting. Light seems to shine forth from within his living and glorified person, emphasized. by red and black. Christ stands upright with his eyes open, looking out at the world; He has already overcome suffering and death. Instead of a crown of thorns, he wears a halo of glory. He still has bleeding wounds which pour out his redeeming blood on the angels and saints. Above, Christ is risen in front of the open empty tomb. In his left hand is the cross and his right hand points to the Father. God's right hand welcomes the Son, surrounded by saints. At Jesus' right side is Mary with her right hand pointed at the beloved disciple, John. At Jesus' left are Mary Magdalene and Mary of Clopas. To their right is the centurion looking at Jesus with his hand raised, saying "Truly, this was the Son of God." Over the centurion's shoulder could be his son who was healed by Christ. At Mary's feet is the soldier who pierced the side of Christ. At the feet of the centurion is the sponge carrier. Beneath the hands of Jesus are pairs of angels with their hands lifted in lively discussion. They stand in front of the open tomb announcing the resurrection and ascension of the Lord. The two persons at the extreme right and left could be either angels or women who have run to the empty tomb.

Br. Benedict: One thing I see in this work of art that I have been aware of since coming to Ray Of Hope is all of the figures in this representation of angles, saints in Heaven, and all the people around Jesus are portrayed as ethnic Caucasians. While this would not have been anything other than an artist unconsciously reflecting their own internalized image of people, today, we might reconsider how we would paint such a dynamic work as this. Today we would show the range of skin colors and ethnic representations in the saints in Heaven or even in the Angels. Also, Jesus would likely have been a person with skin darker than what was commonly seen in Italy, where this artwork was painted.

"Over the years, you will surely have come across this very special and iconic crucifix, known throughout the world as the **Saint Damiano Cross**. The original one is the large Romanesque rood

cross that hung in the abandoned chapel near Assisi, hometown of Saint Francis and Saint Clare. This Cross is now **over 800 years old** and is about six feet tall and four feet wide. It was painted on linen that was glued to walnut wood. **The artist's identity is unknown**, but the Cross has become well known due to its association with **Saint Francis of Assisi**. The Poor Clares preserved it for seven centuries at San Giorgio. No one knows who painted the Cross. It is now kept in the Basilica of Santa Chiara in Assisi,

He would have loved our World Communion celebration because Francis was disturbed by the prominent divisions in his day. The most significant ones being the wealthy and the working poor. The Church was divided between East and West for over 100 years when he was an adult. If he were alive today, he would welcome a celebration such as World Communion Sunday, where the Western Church could set aside her 33,000 + denominations for a day and recognize that the Body Of Christ extends to all points on the Earth. Today, we have new sad divisions that are evening threatening the well-being of some of our denominations. We can look to Francis and hear his voice calling us to set aside our divisions and focus on the worship of God in Christ through the powerful ministry of the Holy Spirit.





³ Praised be the Maker of our Savior Jesus Christ, who has bestowed on us in Christ every spiritual blessing in the heavens! ⁴ Before the world began, God chose us in Christ to be holy and blameless and to be full of love; 5 God likewise predestined us through Christ Jesus to be adopted children—such was God's pleasure and will—⁶ that everyone might praise the glory of God's grace which was freely bestowed on us in God's beloved, Jesus Christ. ⁷ It is in Christ and through the blood of Christ that we have been redeemed and our sins forgiven, so immeasurably generous is God's favor ⁸ given to us with perfect wisdom and understanding. 9 God has taken pleasure in revealing the mystery of the plan through Christ, 10 to be carried out in the fullness of time; namely, to bring all things—in heaven and on earth—together in Christ. ¹¹ In Christ we were willed an inheritance; for in the decree of God—and everything is administered according to the divine will and counsel—we were predestined 12 to praise the glory of the Most High by being the first to hope in Christ. 13 In Christ you too were chosen. Francis openly taught and discussed the Gospel with anyone of any class or status in life. He saw in the reading of the Gospel Christ becoming truly present to everyone. In fact, he was definitely known to go out and preach to the animals in the forest. They loved to hear him, and many people witnessed the animals coming together when he called them. Francis looked forward to the restoration of the Earth when we will have more open and unrestrained communion with all Creation and, yes, including the animals. So, as we hear the Gospel now, let us receive it with burning hearts resolved to follow Christ with a radical yes. Here at Ray Of Hope, we sing an acclamation before and after reading the Gospel. Lisa Frost: Worship is our primary activity as a church. The church has an old standard, lex orandi, lex credendi, which means that "the law of prayer is the law of faith" or "that which we pray is that which we believe." Our prayer, our worship is the key to understanding what God has revealed for us to accept as Eternal Truth. St. Francis and the Eucharist Francis recognized the Body Of Christ in every person. He realized that all of us are inseparable from the living God, the Body Of Christ in the world. Again, he saw no divisions or distinctions in the Body of Christ. In fact, as already noted, he called the church back to celebration of all of Creation.

Women followed Francis from the very beginning. The leader of the women was Clare of Assisi. Clare was the first woman to write a Rule for monasteries that the Pope approved. Clare started the Order of Poor Ladies, which followed strict poverty, and after her death, in her honor, the women renamed it the Order of Saint Clare, today commonly known as The Poor Clares. There are Roman Catholic, Anglican, Lutheran, and Independent houses of The Poor Clares today, numbering about 30,000 women worldwide.

Clare had an extraordinary devotion to Christ present in the Blessed Sacrament, Holy Communion. One night, when invaders were climbing the walls of the convent intending to violate the women, Clare ran to the place where the Holy Communion bread was stored. She placed it in the vessel to show it as seen on the screen, and she walked on the top of the convent walls where the men were climbing up the side. All of them were supernaturally pushed to the ground by the Holy Spirit. For this reason, artists often depict Clare of Assisi holding the monstrance, the vessel to show the Holy Bread as seen on the screen. Clare and Francis truly believed Jesus to be present always and everywhere but especially when the church shared the blessed wine and bread on a day just as beautiful as this day of World Communion.



Dear Friends and Members,

On a recent Monday afternoon the Carbon Monoxide Alarms rang on the first floor of the church and monastery. It turns out the broken bolt and old seal (apparently one was not replaced in the last kit replacement) on the existing boiler were allowing Carbon Monoxide to leak out of the boiler and upstairs through the floor and walls. The boiler is shut off and the system is taken off line because it is leaking Carbon Monoxide. The heat to the entire building is off until the Heat Exchanger Kit is installed.

We have received an estimate from Isaac Heating & Air Conditioning of \$3,230.79 to cover the parts and time it takes two technicians to do the exchange which is approximately 6 hours. This is the initial estimate for phase 1 of repairs needed. The second estimate to add a larger pump to solve the problem of getting the heat upstairs and to the back corners of the building has been received in the amount of \$1,712.83. Therefore the total amount to get the boiler functional and the pump installed is \$4,943.62.

The Council met on Thursday, September 26th and approved the plans to get this urgent emergency repair completed. We are so thankful for all donations received thus far for this repair. There is still a need for donations to help with this as we will need to quickly replenish the funds that will be required from the Building Improvement Fund.

As you may know, we have been saving to get the external building painted and eliminate any potential fines for not being up to code. This current emergency repair will deplete that savings.

So again, we thank all of you for your past generosity and for any financial assistance you can give at this time towards the boiler repair and external painting of the building.

The goal is to get the parts ordered and repair scheduled before we need the boiler to be operational with the declining temperatures as well as the building painted.

Thank you in advance for your support. Any amount given will be of great support.

The Treasurer's Report for the month of August 2024; presented September 26, 2024.

General Fund opening balance at the beginning of the month was \$1,043.91. Donations to the General Fund for the month were \$1,368.50. There were 2 people who deposited their August donations in July, so this figure is lower than normal by about \$800.00 Pastoral compensation of \$495.00 per week was paid, Verizon \$62.13, a reimbursement to me for the wine and grape juice kits of \$91.44 and Paypal charge comes out of this account. After these were paid the ending balance of this account at the end of the month was \$265.34.

Donations to the Building Fund were as follows: Brother Shawn Benedict \$640.00, Kaiden Benedict \$400.00. I transferred back in from Savings \$662.33 also. Regular bills that came out of the fund this month was the Credit Card bill with Key Bank of \$61.42, electric \$233.92 (which has increased \$100 per month), gas bill \$253.00, water bill \$82.79, Fire Inspection fee of \$60.00, Isaac's Plumbing and Heating \$364.95 and I paid the Liability Insurance bill of \$662.33. Ending balance of this fund was \$1,341.34.

Building Improvement Fund opening balance on this account was \$2,452.49. We had no activity on this account during August. Ian & Christina's donation was done on Paypal September 1st, so that will be on next month's report. So the ending balance on this account is \$2,452.29.

Savings (Council) Account opening balance \$705.33. I transferred \$662.33 to the building fund to cover the liability insurance payment, so the ending balance in this account is \$43.65.

These balances do equal the ending bank balances.
