THE SERVICE OF THE WORD OF GOD

+ First Reading: Reader: **** If an introduction is needed: **** Hello. My name is , and I am in the City of in the State of . The first reading is Ezekiel, chapter 34, verses 11-17, in the NRSV 2021 updated edition. The 1989 pew Bibles have a similar reading on page 803 in the First Testament. Listen to an introduction, please. Christ Jesus identifies himself as "The Good Shepherd" in John 10:11, saying, "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep." In verse 14, Jesus continues, "I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me, and I know the Father." The Jewish people who knew the Scriptures were very familiar with the image of "The Good Shepherd" as God. In the letter of First Peter, Chapter 2, verse 25, Jesus is called the shepherd, Guardian, and bishop of our souls. And, of course, he is the Shepherd of Psalm 23. There are many other examples. Jesus is the shepherd, the Guardian, and the leader of our lives now. In this prophecy in the book of Ezekiel, the House of Israel is given the eternal promise that they will be re-gathered into the Land of Israel, and God will shepherd them in person and peace. Even as Israel was reestablished as the State of Israel on May 14, 1948, we clearly can see this is not the peaceful Kingdom that will extend to the entire world. So, when Jesus called Himself the Good Shepherd, those who listened to him realized He was

identifying himself as the Divine Shepherd that was to

establish His Kingdom, which thoroughly offended the religious leaders of the day. Listen closely to this unfulfilled prophecy and realize God will complete each of the promises stated here. Take a quiet moment to absorb the introduction; just read to you aloud. (** pause for reflection **) Here begins the reading.

God, the True Shepherd

¹¹ For thus says the Lord God: I myself will search for my sheep and will sort them out. 12 As shepherds sort out their flocks when they are among scattered sheep, [a] so I will sort out my sheep. I believe the preaching tradition and theological influence of every Pastor and teacher are firmly grounded in their particular adherence to one of the four schools of Eschatology. I have also observed that many preachers are unaware of the school of thought on Eschatology that is influencing their preaching. Ray Of Hope Church Of Our Lord Jesus Christ, Inc. does not require preachers and teachers to adhere to a particular school of thought in Eschatology. I am grounded in Premillennial and Dispensational schools when studying the Last Things.

Each year, during the last weeks of the Church year and the first weeks of Advent, the lectionary (schedule of readings) and the liturgical calendar (seasons and celebrations) focus on Eschatology, the study of the final events of the Bible. I attempt to bring new material for those familiar with the subject, and I remind everyone there are those who are hearing this for the first time and others who have listened to it less than five times before.

I am aiming to be brief today. The Feast of Christ the King was instituted in 1925 by Pope Pius XI as a response to the growing secularism, as he understood it. Today, it is celebrated by most denominations of the Christian Church as the last Sunday of the Church Year, implying the last event will be a final judgment and a spiritual "heavenly"

kingdom. To learn more about the Feast of Christ The King RIGHT CLICK HERE.

The question in theology is what this "kingdom" or "realm" we read about, and when it will happen, if it has it, or if it is happening.

Spiritual / Metaphorical / Symbolic / Myth and Allegorical - It is impossible to know anything about God, Jesus, the Church, or the Bible. The Bible should not be used to understand the past or to anticipate anything in the future. The Bible is an interesting collection of fragments of literature from a broad spectrum of time and place. It is useful as much as one can find some good ethical teachings. The concept of a "kingdom of Christ" in the past, present, or future is simply a misreading of allegorical texts and should be abandoned. Life goes on, so be nice to others, and they will be nice to you. Reach out in peace, and you will establish peace. Be forgiving, and everyone will follow your example. Forgiveness will be our policy, and goodness will be the result everywhere.

Amillennial - There will never be a literal, future kingdom of Christ for a "mille" thousand "annus" years. The "millennium" is interpreted to mean an indeterminate period of time from the life of Christ until the end of the world. This position is held by the Roman Church and most "mainline" Protestant Churches. This interpretation began in the middle of the 5th Century. The institutional church is the expression of the Kingdom of Christ. Still, it only influences those who want to be affected, and they are assured of a spiritual forever not fully understood but called Heaven. At times, churches have threatened those who do not want to comply with an after-death existence of Hell, but frankly, these churches have never proved or disproved that Heaven or Hell exists as far as non-believers critique their proof.

Postmillennial - The church age is the "millennium," though not measured as 1,000 years. While this school of interpretation has evolved, the current understanding can be traced back to European colonization of non-European countries and even continents "for Christ." Even more recently, beginning in the 1930s and energized by the second half of the 1970s, this group of churches and parachurch organizations is causing social upheaval and pulling back on Scientific and academic progress in the name of "conservatism." This school of Theology encourages the use of all levels of government as the instrument to force pagan, non-conservative-Christian, and all forms of socially liberal people into compliance with "Christian" laws. It is assumed most people need "Christian laws" and policies to form people into the mindset ordained by God, and so a theocracy can be formed. Currently, the "MAGA" movement is drawing organizational strength from Postmillennial, Theocratic, Autocratic, "Christian" White Nationalist thinkers, movers, and shakers. One crucial aspect of this form of "Christianity" is the idea that Christ cannot return to the Earth to end the world, the millennium until every human converts to the uniquely "USA," "evangelical," "conservative," and "Christian" religion under their leadership. Much of this comes from a few verses in Scripture, Acts 3:19-22

¹⁹ Repent, therefore, and turn to God so that your sins may be wiped out, ²⁰ so that times of refreshing

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may come from the presence of the Lord and that he may send the Messiah appointed for you, that is, Jesus, ²¹ who must remain in heaven until the time of universal restoration that God announced long ago through his holy prophets. ²² Moses said, 'The Lord your God will raise up for you from your own people a prophet like me. You must listen to whatever he tells you. (NRSVUE https://www.biblegateway.com/passage/?search=Acts+3%3A19-22&version=NRSVUE)

This "times of refreshing" is interpreted as the resurrection from the dead. Therefore, laws must be enacted from Church councils, city councils, state houses, political party platforms, federal law, and international laws to usher it in as quickly as possible. All law must be brought into compliance with this particular form of "Christianity" so those who refuse to comply may be prosecuted, jailed, and or executed so Christ may return.

Premillennial - This school of Theology has roots in the Apostles and the writers of books of the Bible from Moses to John the Beloved Apostle. As the title implies, a simple reading of Scripture at face value situates many prophesies as yet unfulfilled. Over one hundred prophecies were literally fulfilled in Christ's first coming to the Earth. It is reasonable to expect the remaining prophecies will also be fulfilled in due time, exactly as written. The church is not the Kingdom, and the world is not the Kingdom. The Kingdom will be the Kingdom when it is established "on Earth as it is in Heaven," as we have prayed all our lives. During this intermittent time, "all authority in heaven and earth" has been given to Jesus, who is building his Church. The Church on Earth is the Kingdom in the sense of bringing the Gospel to everyone and proclaiming the "Blessed Hope," the soon-coming return of Christ to end the Church Age by resurrecting and transforming millions and returning to Paradise with them "in the air." Seven years later, Jesus will return this time to the Earth, resurrect the House of Israel, and establish the physical Kingdom on Earth, with the central capital being Jerusalem on the Temple Mount.

During the current age, it is clearly understood that Humanity is aligned with fallen Lucifer as "the god of this World" and the "ruler of this Age" (John 12:31) (2 Cor. 4:4) Satan is leading the whole world astray. (Rev. 12:9). Satan is the prince of the powers of the air, the fallen spirit world. (Ephs. 2:1-2)

Every person has the free will to choose whom they will serve during this age.

(Matt. 28:18-20) ¹⁸ And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. ¹⁹ Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit ²⁰ and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age." ^[6] (Matt. 16:18b) I will build My church; and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it.

What do we do???? First, be the church. Do not attend a church service; be the church with your service to everyone. Explain to people your hope and motivation to serve them in any way they need, that you are blessed with the assurance that Christ is coming and that he will establish his Kingdom. Explain the answer to their question: "What kind of god would allow all this sickness, death, crime, war, murders, all this sin?" The answer: the

god of this world system is behind all of this, and unfortunately, he is gathering many sheep. Jesus describes him as the thief who comes into the flock to capture, crush, kill, and destroy the sheep. (read John Chapter 10) People are seduced by what they think is power, security, treasure, satisfaction, and abundance. Then, they must fight to keep it and turn to the world system.

The God of Creation, Who sent His only begotten Son to redeem us from all this chaos, allows us to make our choices out of love so we are not bound unwillingly to God's will. We are free to choose; our choices will ultimately steer our eschaton, our final things and events.

Who is driving the car of my life? Only I can answer that question. Perhaps I have given the steering wheel and the keys to the god of this age, "Aion," this world system "kosmos." My aim is to choose to give the steering wheel and the keys to the Good Shepherd, the Bishop of Souls, the King of Hearts who that Him, the Guardian of my Soul, the Saviour of the World, daily. Christ has come, Christ is Risen, Christ will come again.

Here is a quick Premillennial understanding of today's readings.

- 1) Ezek. 34:11-17 God shepherds those who listen for God's presence and make themselves available to God's instruction. God will establish the House of Israel in her land in peace and rule as the Good Shepherd King over all the earth.
 - 2) Colossians Canticle 1:15-20 Christ is primary "before all else that is." Creation came through Christ; Christ was born in the flesh, died, buried, and raised by God. Christ even holds all things in the continuance of being, holds all things together in the Universe, even though the Universe is in constant motion. Christ is the head of the Church, so that primacy may be His in everything QUAS PRIMAS
- 3) Second Reading; 1 Corinthians 15:20-28 Jesus is the first fruits of those who have died. Jesus is the second Adam and has brought resurrection to all. In Christ all will be made alive 1 Cor. 15:22. Then the order of the timing is given: Christ first, those who are alive at his coming (rapture), then his kingdom and when it is ended, "He delivers the kingdom to God the Father" after ruling as king of all kingdoms and lord of all lords all governments will be under his final authority on Earth. When Christ delivers the Kingdom to God, the "last enemy will be destroyed, death." (1 cor 15:26) Then the Son will be subject to God and in the final renewal God will be "all in all." There is a chronology to this, a specific order given.
- 4) In Gospel Matthew 25:31-46, Jesus describes his coming in glory to the Earth in detail. this event happens after the details explained in Matthew 24:1 through 25:30 that describe the current and Tribulation ages. AFTER these events, Jesus comes in his glory to the

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Earth. He sets up his throne. All persons living at the time will come before Jesus for separation, either into the physical kingdom on Earth or into the Lake of Fire. Notice how the specifics of this are entirely different than last Sunday, where we read and discussed the Lord's coming "in the air" to "catch up" rapiemur 1 Thess. 4:17.

WHO SHOULD RECEIVE HOLY COMMUNION, THE EUCHARIST, AT RAY OF HOPE CHURCH?

Everyone may receive Holy Communion, also known as The Eucharist, The Lord's Table, or The Blessed Sacrament at Ray Of Hope Church Of Our Lord Jesus Christ, Inc.

You are not required to be a member of this Church or any other church to receive Holy Communion at / or with Ray Of Hope Church.

This Holy Communion is the Table of Jesus Christ, who is present among us. Jesus invites you to receive Him in this Eucharistic banquet. If this is your first time receiving The Blessed Sacrament, let us know before you receive it, or right after so we might pray a special prayer of thanksgiving with you.

Unfortunately, through the centuries, many institutional churches have established rules, teachings, and practices that exclude people from Holy Communion. There has been an almost endless list of reasons to exclude people from the Blessed Sacrament. Yet, together, during the worship service, we recite the very words of Jesus, the Words of Institution, "This is my body. This is my blood," and we rehear Christ present with us saying: "Take this, all of you and eat; Take this all of you and drink" of this gift.

After extensive consideration, I take these words, "Take this, all of you.." as a command to the Church to give and bring the Eucharistic Gift to everyone who will receive. This approach also requires us to educate people about this gift. I have said it is uniquely and deliberately the work of Christ in His Church to offer the necessary education, guidance, and practices that help people live a life centered and purposed on finding and sharing the Will of God. The Lord's Table is central to that life.

The Eucharist belongs to the Church. The Blessed Sacrament is Christ in, through, with us, and made known in breaking the Bread of Life and drinking the Cup of Salvation. We are to take this gift to the whole World.

We begin by inviting those on the fringe of Society, those pushed aside, poor, not accepted, sick, and who need God's help in extraordinary ways.

We welcome and bring the Eucharist to everyone told they cannot receive it by other Denominations. In conclusion, to everyone told "no, you cannot" go to Communion in any other church; hear us, "yes, you can" at Ray Of Hope. All are welcome. Or, as we like to say as one of our mottos when we quote Fr. Bartholomew J. O'Brien, "You are as welcome here as Christ Himself."
