Today is November 26, 2023, the First Sunday of Advent, the start of a new year in the church calendar in our 41st year of ministry. Today's theme: Praying for World Peace.

We are following the Lectionary Readings today for week two - Peace, so that next Sunday, the one closest to World AIDS Day, we can use the readings for Hope. Today is also week 3 of 6 weeks on the theme of Eschatology.

There is the continuation of the theme of the Good Shepherd we had last week continued in today's readings. This first song asks the Good Shepherd to rescue the Human Race from all the cruelty we enact upon each other. Save us, O Lord, from war, corrupt governments, failure in the Church, and the breakdown of relationships, and you can go on with your list. Save us, O Lord, from Racism, Homophobia, Transphobia, fear of gender expression, fear of bisexual family structure, fear of polyamorous families, from all the ways your Holy Spirit is calling us to a better society. People of fear and control are trying to stop the progress of the Holy Spirit. We need an intervention today brought to us by the Good Shepherd of Israel, the Shepherd of Souls, the Head of the Church, His Body. In this first song, we make a plea for His assistance.

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+ The Advent Wreath Week 1, 2023 – *the candle of Peace.*

Leader -1: Please be seated. Today, we begin the season of Advent, the beginning of a new year in the Church. We start over in the cycle of Sunday Scripture readings to listen anew to the living Word of God. Advent is a time of renewal, fresh beginnings, ages old, present, and future.

ALL: Advent is also a season of longing, filled with expectation, excited by hope, sprinkled with potential and promise.

Leader -2: The Advent Wreath shows many meaningful symbols. The evergreen reminds us of the eternal promises of God's sustaining grace. God is faithful and will fulfill every promise made in Scripture. The four candles remind us of our place in time as we move forward in God's plan. Each candle has a name and a theme.

This year, the first candle is purple, named for Peace. We are dedicating it to our prayers for World Peace.

The second candle is also purple, named for Hope. On the second candle we display the Red AIDS Ribbon for World AIDS Day.

The third candle is the rose color for Joy, and it is when we celebrate Pride in the Winter and have our holiday party.

The fourth candle is purple and named for Love. On the 4th Sunday, we will celebrate Holy Mother Mary and all Holy Women of Faith, a Holy Mother's Day in the Winter.

Leader -3: At this time, we will bless our Advent Wreath or Advent Yule Log with Holy Water. First, we must bless the water to make it holy. Please pick up and hold the container with the water or touch it and pray silently as I pray out loud. (*please pause*) Dear God, we dedicate this water to you and ask you to make it Holy, setting it apart as an instrument of your blessings. We ask this in the name of Jesus.

ALL: Amen.

Pastor: Please sprinkle your Advent Wreath or your Advent Log now. If you have incense, you may light it now as a symbol of prayer rising before God.

Leader -1: The Book of Malachi, Chapter one, verse eleven reads; "From the rising of the sun to its setting my Name is great among the nations, and in every place incense is offered to my Name, and a pure offering; for my Name is great among the nations, says the Lord of Hosts." In the Gospel of Luke, chapter one, verses eight through eleven we read, the father of John the Baptist, was serving as priest before God. Zechariah entered "the sanctuary of the Lord and offered incense. ¹⁰ Now at the time of the incense offering, the whole assembly of the people was praying outside. ¹¹ Then there appeared to him an angel of the Lord, standing at the right side of the altar of incense."

Also, in the Book of Revelation, we read about elders holding bowls of incense, "which are the prayers of the saints." (Revelation 5:8) We therefore see from these three readings that incense symbolizes our prayers rising to the Lord.

ALL: "May our prayers rise before you, O Lord, as incense to the sky, the raising of our hands like an evening oblation." (Psalm 141:2)

Pastor: We pray aloud together now:





Closing Gospel Acclamation





It is my opinion the preaching tradition and theological influence of every pastor and teacher is firmly grounded in their particular adherence to one of the four schools of Eschatology.

I am grounded in Premillennial and Dispensational schools when it comes to the study of the Last Things.

Basically, the question in Theology is what is this "kingdom" or "realm" we read about and when will it, or has it, or is it happening.

Spiritual / Metaphorical / Symbolic / Myth and Allegorical - It is impossible to know anything about God, Jesus, the Church, the Bible. The Bible should not be used to understand the past or to anticipate anything in the future. The Bible is an interesting collection of pieces of literature from a wide spectrum of time and place. It is useful in as much as one can find some good ethical teachings in it. The concept of a "kingdom of Christ" in the past, or present, or future is simply a misreading of allegorical texts and should be abandoned. Life goes on so be nice to others and they will be nice to you. Reach out in peace and you will establish peace. Be forgiving and everyone will follow your example and forgiveness will be our policy and goodness the results everywhere in the world.

Amillennial - There will never be a literal, future kingdom of Christ for a "mille" thousand "annus" years. The "millennium" is interpreted to mean an indeterminate period of time from the life of Christ until the end of the world. This position is held by the Roman Church, and most "mainline" Protestant Churches. This interpretation began in the middle 5th Century. The institutional church is the expression of the Kingdom of Christ but only influences those who want to be influenced and they are assured of a spiritual forever not fully understood but called Heaven. At times churches have threatened those who do not want to comply with an after-death existence of Hell, but, frankly these churches have never proved or disproved that Heaven or Hell exist as far as non-believers critique their proof.

Postmillennial - The church age is the "millennium" though not measured out as 1,000 years. While this school of interpretation has seen some evolution, the current understanding can be traced back to European colonization of non-European countries and even continents "for Christ." Even more recently, beginning in the 1930's and energized by the second half of the 1970's, this group of churches and parachurch organizations is causing social upheaval and pulling back on Scientific and academic progress in the name of "conservatism." This school of Theology encourages the use of all levels of government as the instrument to force pagan, non-conservative-christian, and all forms of social liberal people into compliance with "Christian" laws. It is assumed most people need "Christian" laws" and policies to form people into the mindset ordained by God and so a theocracy can be formed. Currently the "MAGA" movement is drawing organizational strength from Postmillennial, Theocratic, Autocratic, "Christian" White Nationalist thinkers, movers, and shakers. One very important aspect of this form of "Christianity" is the idea that Christ cannot return to the Earth to end the world, the millennium, until every human is converted to the uniquely "USA," "evangelical," "conservative," "christian" religion under their leadership. Much of this comes from a few verses in Scripture, Acts 3:19-22

¹⁹ Repent, therefore, and turn to God so that your sins may be wiped out, ²⁰ so that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord and that he may send the Messiah appointed for you, that is, Jesus, ²¹ who must remain in heaven until the time of universal restoration that God announced long ago through his holy prophets. ²² Moses said, 'The Lord your God will raise up for you from your own people a prophet like me. You must listen to whatever he tells you. (NRSVUE https://www.biblegateway.com/passage/?search=Acts+3%3A19-22&version=NRSVUE)

This "times of refreshing" is understood as the resurrection from the dead. Therefore, to usher it is as fast as possible, laws must be enacted from Church councils, to city councils, to state houses, to political party platforms, to federal law, to international laws. All law must be brought into compliance with this particular form of "Christianity" so those who refuse to comply may be prosecuted, jailed, and or executed so Christ may return.

Premillennial - This school of Theology has roots to the Apostles and the writers of books of the Bible from Moses to John the Beloved Apostle. As the title implies, a simple reading

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of Scripture at face value situates many prophesies as yet unfulfilled. Over one hundred prophecies were literally fulfilled in Christ's first coming to the Earth. It is reasonable to expect the remaining prophecies will also be literally fulfilled in due time, exactly as written. The church is not the Kingdom, the world is not the Kingdom. The Kingdom will be the Kingdom when it is established "on Earth as it is in Heaven" as we have prayed all our lives. During this intermittent time "all authority in heaven and earth" has been given to Jesus and he is building his Church. The Church on Earth is the Kingdom in the sense of bringing the Gospel to absolutely everyone and proclaiming the "Blessed Hope" the soon coming return of Christ to end the Church Age by resurrecting and transforming millions and returning to Paradise with them "in the air." Seven years later Jesus will return this time to the Earth, resurrect the House of Israel, and establish the physical Kingdom on Earth with the central capital being Jerusalem on Temple Mount.

During the current age it is clearly understood that Humanity is aligned with fallen Lucifer as "the god of this World" and the "ruler of this Age" (John 12:31) (2 Cor. 4:4) Satan is leading the whole world astray. (Rev. 12:9) Satan is the prince of the powers of the air, that is the fallen spirit world. (Ephs. 2:1-2)

Every person has the free will to choose whom they will serve during this age.

(Matt. 28:18-20) ¹⁸ And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. ¹⁹ Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit ²⁰ and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age." (Matt. 16:18b) I will build My church; and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it.

What do we do???? First, be the church. Do not attend a church service, be the church with your service to all and everyone. Explain to people your hope and motivation to serve them in any way they need, that you are filled with a blessed assurance that Christ is coming and that he will establish his Kingdom. Explain the answer to their question: "What kind of god would allow all this sickness, death, crime, war, murders, all this sin?" The answer: the god of this world system is behind all of this and unfortunately he is gathering many sheep. Jesus describes him as the thief who comes into the flock to capture, crush, kill and destroy the sheep. (read John Chapter 10) People are seduced by what they think is power, security, treasure, satisfaction, and abundance. Then they have to fight to keep it and they turn to the world system.

The God of Creation, Who sent His only begotten Son to redeem us from all this chaos, allows us to make our choices, out of love so we are not bound unwillingly to God's will. We are free to choose and the choices we are making will ultimately steer our eschaton, our final things and events.

Who is driving the car of my life? Only I can answer that question. Perhaps I have given the steering wheel and the keys to the god of this age, "aion" this world system "kosmos." My aim is to daily choose to give the steering wheel and the keys to the Good Shepherd, the Bishop of Souls, the King of Hearts who love Him, the Guardian of my Soul, the Saviour

Here is a quick Premillennial understanding of today's readings.

Today's readings are eternal in scope, as shown with Scripture prophecies yet to be fulfilled: Isaiah 40, verses seven and eight: "The grass withers, the flowers fade away, but the word of our God stands forever." The promises God has made that have not been fulfilled will surely be completed to every last detail. Why? God was here before we were born and will continue after we die; God is forever.

In the following verses, the promise is made that His reward will be with Him when He comes. Later, we read that "all the angels with be with Jesus" and all the dead He has raised and the living He has transformed will be with Him when He comes to establish His kingdom on earth as it is in Heaven. The angels and the resurrected are his "reward" that will be with Him.

Isaiah 40:9-11

⁹ Get you up to a high mountain, O Zion, herald of good news;^[C]
lift up your voice with strength, O Jerusalem, herald of good news;^[d]
lift it up, do not fear;
say to the cities of Judah, "Here is your God!"
¹⁰ See, the Lord GOD comes with might, and his arm rules for him;
his reward is with him and his recompense before him.
¹¹ He will feed his flock like a shepherd; he will gather the lambs in his arms and carry them in his bosom and gently lead the mother sheep.

Today's readings are also present and in the moment in scope. Psalm 85 is our response to these promises.

There is the continuation of the theme of the Good Shepherd we had last week continued in today's readings. This first song asks the Good Shepherd to rescue the Human Race from all the cruelty we enact upon each other. Save us, O Lord, from war, corrupt governments, failure in the Church, and the breakdown of relationships, and you can go on with your list. Save us, O Lord, from Racism, Homophobia, Transphobia, fear of gender expression, fear of bisexual family structure, fear of polyamorous families, from all the ways your Holy Spirit is calling us to a better society. People of fear and control are trying to stop the progress of the Holy Spirit. We need an intervention today brought to us by the Good Shepherd of Israel, the

It seems almost impossible given the current condition of people's choices – war, power, greed, and corruption of every kind. We, however, listen for the voice of the Good Shepherd, as we talked about last Sunday in Ezek. 34:11-17 God shepherds those who listen for God's presence and make themselves available to God's instruction. God will establish the House of Israel in her land in peace and rule as the Good Shepherd King over all the earth. We understand how significant it was when Jesus identified Himself as the Good Shepherd in John, Chapter 10. He alone can give us the peace that is eternal. Only Jesus can give eternal peace as he promised in John 14:27: ²⁷ Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid.

In this present moment, we pray with the psalmist: "Lord, we wait and long for the fullness of your Kingdom." Then, in His Kingdom, "justice, kindness, and peace shall meet." (Psalm 85:8-13)

THE GOSPEL READING: John, the baptizer, was a cousin of Jesus about six months older than Jesus. John and his family, the High Priest Zachariah, his mother, Elizabeth, and many others believed the prophecies. They understood their son and the son of Joseph and Mary were the two who fulfilled the prophecies of the one to Prepare The Way of the Lord. The one who would be the Child sent and given whose Name would be Wonderful, Counselor, The Mighty God Everlasting, and Prince of Peace, and his Name is Jesus.

So often, we hear it said; this is taking too long. Or, forget about this second-coming myth. Or, we don't need to hang on religious mythology that upholds false hope, etc.. These are false teachers, misguided churches, and false religions who have given up on the faithful Shepherd of Souls. IN THE SECOND READING, we are told not to disbelieve but to wait for God's timing.

2 Peter 3:8-10

⁸ But do not ignore this one fact, beloved, that with the Lord one day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years are like one day. ⁹ The Lord is not slow about his promise, as some think of slowness, but is patient with you,^[a] not wanting any to perish but

11-26-23 Advent WK I readings WK 2, Year B Page 23 of 42 all to come to repentance. ¹⁰ But the day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then the heavens will pass away with a loud noise, and the elements will be destroyed with fire, and the earth and everything that is done on it will be disclosed.^[b]

The events described refer to the Kingdom's end after the SECOND COMING and after Jesus rules the Kingdom on Earth for 1,000 years. Then, the Armies of the Anti-Christ will be destroyed, and God will reform the Earth and make it new.

FINALLY, we are waiting for the end of the Church Age, the great "catching up" in Latin rapiemur, named the "Rapture." We are to wait with our lamps trimmed and ready and filled with the oil of the Holy Spirit.

We may wait with perfect peace. 2 Peter 3:14, 15 Final Exhortation and Doxology

¹⁴ Therefore, beloved, while you are waiting for these things, strive to be found by him at peace, without spot or blemish, ¹⁵ and regard the patience of our Lord as salvation.



There has been an almost endless list of reasons to exclude people from the Blessed Sacrament. Yet, together, during the worship service, we recite the very words of Jesus, the Words of Institution, "This is my body. This is my blood," and we rehear Christ present with us saying: "Take this, all of you and eat; Take this all of you and drink" of this gift.

After extensive consideration, I take these words, "Take this, all of you.." as a command to the Church to give and bring the Eucharistic Gift to everyone who will receive. This approach also requires us to educate people about this gift. I have said **it is uniquely and deliberately the work of Christ in His Church** to offer the necessary education, guidance, and practices that help people live a life centered and purposed on finding and sharing the Will of God. The Lord's Table is central to that life.
