

Leader -3: Please be seated. Today we begin the Advent season, the beginning of a new year in the Church. We start over in the cycle of Sunday Scripture readings to listen anew to the living Word of God. Advent is a time of renewal, fresh beginnings, of ages old, present, and future.

ALL: This is also a season of longing, filled with expectation, excited by hope, sprinkled with potential and promise.

Leader -2: The evergreen on the wreath reminds us of the eternal promises of God's sustaining grace. God is faithful and will fulfill every promise made in Scripture. The four candles remind us of our place in time as we move forward in God's plan. Each candle has a name and a theme.



The first candle is purple and is named for Hope. On the first candle we also have the Red AIDS Ribbon for World AIDS Day.

The second candle is also purple and is named for Peace.

The third candle is rose color and is for Joy, it is when we shall celebrate Pride in the Winter, Gaudete Sunday, December 11, 2022. Gaudete is Latin for Rejoice.

The fourth candle is purple and is named for Love. On this, the 4th Sunday we will celebrate Holy Mother Mary and all Holy Women of Faith for a Mother's and Women's Day in the Winter.


Leader -1: Now, we will bless our Advent Wreath or Advent Yule Log with Holy Water. First, we dedicate and bless the water we are using. Please pick up the container with the water or touch the water, and pray silently as I pray out loud. (please wait) Dear God, we dedicate this water to you and ask you to make it Holy, setting it apart as an instrument of your blessings. We ask this in the name of Jesus.

ALL: Amen.

Pastor: Sprinkle your Advent Wreath or your Advent Log now. If you have incense you may light it as a symbol of prayer rising before God.

Leader -4: In the book of Malachi, chapter one, verse 11, we read; "From the rising of the sun to its setting my Name is great among the nations, and in every place incense is offered to my Name, and a pure offering; for my Name is great among the nations, says the Lord of Hosts."

In the Gospel of Luke 1:8-11 Zechariah, the father of John the Baptist, was serving as priest before God. Zechariah entered "the sanctuary of the Lord and offered incense. ¹⁰ Now at the time of the incense offering, the whole assembly of the people was praying outside. ¹¹ Then there appeared to him an angel of the Lord, standing at the right side of the altar of incense."



Incense is a symbol of our prayers rising up to the Lord.

ALL: "May our prayers rise before you, O Lord, as incense to the sky, the raising of our hands like an evening oblation." (Psalm 141:2)

Pastor: We pray aloud together now:

ALL: O Loving and Gracious God, we ask your Holy Spirit to bless these Advent decorations, to bless this holy season, and to bless us as we begin our journey with You anew. We dedicate ourselves and these next four weeks of Advent to you. We ask you to speak to us, guide us, and impassion our hearts with your Divine Love. We make these prayes in the Name of (*+*) God, the Christ, and the Holy Spirit. Amen.





Leader -2: Here we light the first candle. Please show it on your camera if you can. Thank you. (wait)

Leader -3: Thursday is December 1, World AIDS Day. Every Sunday, we light the Candle Of Hope at Ray Of Hope Church, and we read names from the NAMES Project AIDS Memorial Quilt to ensure we remember those who lost their lives to the H.I.V. Virus. It just happens that the first candle on the Advent Wreath is also named Hope. So, as we sing O Come, O Come Emmanuel in just a moment, keep in mind all those who have gone before us, especially those who died of AIDS, and for the second year in a row we add those who have passed of COVID-19. We also remember everyone who has entered the divine protection of Christ through death, even this week. Scripture decleares Jesus is Lord of the living and of the Dead (Romans 14:9). When Emmanuel comes to take us home, all who have died before that day will come with Him and receive their resurrection bodies.

Notice the Hymn is a promise to Israel, that is the House of Israel. We are the Church, we rejoice, yes, but we celebrate these promises to Isarael. This is the "futurist" or Premillennial interpretation. Together we sing the first two verses of <u>O Come</u>, <u>O Come</u> Emmanuel.

O come, O come, Emmanuel, And ransom captive Israel, that mourns in lonely exile here until the Word of God appear.

Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to you, O Israel. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to you, O Israel.

Christian eschatology is a major branch of study within <u>Christian theology</u>. <u>Eschatology</u>, from two Greek words meaning "last" ($\xi \sigma \chi \alpha \tau \sigma \varsigma$) and "study" (- $\lambda \sigma \gamma (\alpha)$), is the study of 'end things', whether the end of an individual life, the <u>end of the age</u>, the end of the world and the nature of the Kingdom of God.

There are four dogmatic understandings of the one thousand year, or millennial, or Kingdom of Christ that denominations hold.

Remember, Dogmas are required beliefs that may change very slowly, even over hundreds of years. Dogmas are decided by the religious authority and are not dependent on being stated in the sacred writing, in our case, the Bible.

Four dogmatic understandings of the "kingdom of Christ."

- 1) Amillennial
- 2) Postmillennial
- 3) Premillennial
- 4) Spiritual

Reminder: Ray Of Hope Church does not have a declared dogmatic position on eschatology. Each person is free to accept any understanding of eschatology. The position I, Pastor Benedict, have found to be the most logical and faithful to the Scriptures is Premillennial Eschatology. I find it compelling that the church taught the premillennial view until the middle of the fifth century. The reasons for abandoning the premillennial approach had little to do with Scripture and were deeply bound up in politics.

Theologians re-evaluated eschatology during the 18th and 19th centuries and renewed their commitment to the premillennial position.

Dispensational premillennialism¹²⁹ can be identified through two basic features: (1) a distinction is made between God's program for Israel and His program for the church; (2) a consistently literal interpretation of the Scriptures is maintained.

The church from the beginning was premillennial in belief. The Didache (c. The distinction between Israel and the church. The term Israel always refers to the physical posterity of Jacob; nowhere does it refer to the church.132 Although nondispensationalists frequently refer to the church as the "new Israel," there is no biblical warrant for doing so. Many passages indicate Israel was still regarded as a distinct entity after the birth of the church (Rom. 9:6; 1 Cor. 10:32). Israel was given unconditional promises (covenants) in the Old Testament that must be fulfilled with Israel in the millennial kingdom. The church, on the other hand, is a distinct New Testament entity born at Pentecost (1Cor. 12:13) and not existing in the Old Testament, nor prophesied in the Old Testament (Eph. 3:9). It exists from Pentecost (Acts 2) until the rapture (1 Thess. 4:13–18). Herein lies the reason for belief in the pretribulation rapture: the purpose of the tribulation is to judge unbelieving Gentiles and to discipline disobedient Israel (Jer. 30:7); the church does not have purpose or place in the tribulation.

Communion is a gift for the worship community to celebrate together, an action of the local church. However, if this is an extraordinary situation, and you believe the Holy Spirit is calling you to celebrate at a time other than the live webcast, then yield to the direction of the Holy Spirit. Hopefully, you will be able to join us in a live virtual worship event soon. (This practice policy was changed on Gaudete Sunday, December 13, 2020.*)

In the chapel we are using the small Communion set at your seat. Shake the kit gently in case the contents have settled. After receiving Communion, someone will collect the cup.

(*The Pastor may invite someone to say this prayer out loud.*)

Pastor: Blessed are you, Lord, God of all creation. Through your goodness, we have this bread, which the Earth has given us, and human hands have lovingly made. Now, through the powerful ministry of the Holy Spirit, this bread will become for us the Bread From Heaven (Exodus 16:2, Psalm 78:24, John 6:32, 41,50,58), the Bread of the Angels (Psalm 78:25), the Bread of God (John 6:33), the Living Bread (John 6:51), the Bread Of Life (John 6:35, 48, 58), the Bread of the New Covenant (John 6:32, 49, 50,51, 58), the Sacrament of the Eucharist, the very Body Of Christ (John 6:52-56, 1Corinthians 10:16).

ALL: Blessed be God forever.

Kaiden: Please set down your bread. In the chapel, please continue to hold your communion kit.

For those at home, pour your wine or grape juice into your cup if you have not already done so. Then add a small amount of water to the cup. With this water, we remember Jesus is human. With this fruit of the vine, we remember He is divine forever.

Pastor: Now, please lift your cup with me as I pray this prayer. (*The Pastor may invite someone to say this prayer out loud.*)

Pastor: Blessed are you, Lord, God of all creation. Through your goodness, we have this fruit of the vine, which the Earth has given us and human hands have lovingly made. Now, through the powerful ministry of the Holy Spirit, this fruit of the vine will become for us the Cup of Our Salvation (Psalm 116:13), the Cup of Everlasting Life (John 6:54-57), the Cup of the New Covenant (Matthew 26:28, Luke 22:20, 1 Corinthians 11:25), the very Blood Of Christ (John 6:54-56; 1Corinthians 10:16).

ALL: Blessed be God forever.

Pastor: Please set down your cup.

Pastor: Truly present and risen among us; the Lord is with you!

ALL: And also with you!

Pastor: As His Body, we lift up our hearts!

ALL: We lift them up to the Lord!

Pastor: As His Church, we give thanks to the Lord, our God!

ALL: It is right to give God thanks and praise.

Pastor: It is truly right and just, our duty and our salvation, always and everywhere to give you thanks, Lord, almighty and eternal God. We praise You in the company of all the Faithful from every time and every place. We thank you for every person who shared in this ministry, especially our Foundresses, Founders, and those

visionaries who dared to step up and form a church where everyone is welcome when AIDS was causing a great deal of fear, even in the churches. Cheryl: You may relax your arms and hands.

Pastor: Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world. (John 1:29,36) Behold Jesus truly present in the Bread of Life and

the Cup of Salvation. Behold Him who said whoever eats of this Bread and drinks of this Cup though they die shall live forever. (John 6:50, 51, 54) Blessed are those who come to His Table. All are welcome.

ALL: Lord, you make me worthy to receive you, and by your Word, I am healed. (This prayer is credited to Fr. James Callan, Spiritus Christi of Rochester, NY.)



+ The Words Of The Institution Of The Holy Eucharist

Leader-1: Push down on the tab of your kits. Open the first seal and remove the bread. Please lift the Eucharistic Body Of Christ, the Bread of Salvation, and together we will say our Lord and Saviour's words of institution when he gave us the Blessed Sacrament.

ALL: Before He was given up to death, a death He freely accepted, He took the bread and gave you thanks. He broke the bread, gave it to his disciples, and said:

Take this, all of you, and eat it: This is my body which will be given up for you. Do this in memory of me.

(** pause for adoration**) (**you may bow or genuflect if you choose to**)

Pastor: You may now receive the Bread of Life, the Body of Christ. The Gift of God for the People of God.

Leader-1: We are not going to open the seal on the cup just yet. Please lift now the cup of salvation, and together we will say:

ALL: When the supper was ended, He took the cup. Again He gave you thanks and praise, gave the cup to His disciples, and said:

Take this, all of you, and drink from it: This is the cup of my blood, the blood of the new and everlasting covenant. It will

be shed for you and for all so that sins may be forgiven. Do this in memory of me.

(** pause for adoration**) (**you may bow or genuflect if you choose to**)

Pastor: I assure you, by the promises of Christ, that anyone who receives this Holy Communion today will indeed receive sanctification and healing in mind, body, soul, and spirt, be raised by Christ to new life, and live forever.

Leader-2: We proclaim our faith together.

ALL: Lord, by your cross and resurrection, you have set us free. You are the Savior of the world.

Leader-3: Some people are watching from a location where they do not have actual Holy Communion Bread and Wine with them. This prayer assures all the benefits and blessings of a physical reception. Together...

Oh, My Jesus, I believe that you are truly present in the Blessed Sacrament of the Altar. I love you above all things, and I welcome you in my soul. Since I cannot now receive you in the Sacrament of your Body and Blood, come spiritually into my heart. Cleanse and strengthen me with your grace, Lord Jesus, and let me never be separated from you. May I live in you, and you in me, in this life and the life to come. Amen.

Spiritual Communion Prayer from the Episcopal National Cathedral Prayer Book.

A spiritual communion is a personal devotional that anyone can pray at any time to express their desire to receive Holy Communion at that moment, but in which circumstances impede them from actually receiving Holy Communion.



WHO SHOULD RECEIVE HOLY COMMUNION, THE EUCHARIST, AT RAY OF HOPE CHURCH?

Everyone is invited to receive Holy Communion, also known as The Eucharist, The Lord's Table, or The Blessed Sacrament at Ray Of Hope Church Of Our Lord Jesus Christ, Inc.

It is not required that you be a member of this church or any other church, to receive Holy Communion at / or with Ray Of Hope Church.

This Holy Communion is the Table of Jesus Christ, who is really present among us. Jesus invites you to receive Him in this

Eucharistic banquet. If this is your first time receiving The Blessed Sacrament, let us know before you receive or right after, so we might pray a special prayer of thanksgiving with you.

Unfortunately, through the centuries many institutional churches have established rules, teachings, and practices that would exclude people from Holy Communion. There has been an almost endless list of reasons to exclude people from the Blessed Sacrament. Yet, together, during the worship service, we recite the very words of Jesus, the Words of Institution, "This is my body. This is my blood," and we rehear Christ present with us saying: "Take this, all of you and eat; Take this all of you and drink" of this gift.

I have thought about this extensively and have decided to take these words "Take this, all of you.." as a command to the church to give, and bring, the Eucharistic Gift to everyone who will receive. This approach also requires us to teach people about this gift. We begin by inviting those who are on the fringe of Society, those who have been pushed aside, those who are poor, who are not accepted, who are sick, who need God's help in special ways. We welcome and bring the Eucharist to everyone who has been told they cannot receive it by other Denominations. In conclusion, to all persons who have ever been told "no you cannot" go to Communion in any other church; hear us, "yes you can" at Ray Of Hope. All are welcome. Or as we like to say as one of our
