Today is February 18, 2024, the First of Five Sundays of Lent, in our 41st year of ministry. The sixth Sunday is Palm Sunday, the start of Holy Week. During these five weeks Lent, we take time to look within ourselves to find those areas in our spiritual life that we could grow and begin to do those things to facilitate that growth.

February 18 is also the third Sunday in Black History Month. In response to our Statement Of Purpose (<u>http://www.rayofhopechurch.com/purpose.htm</u>) we use the word "racism" to acknowledge the undeniable record of the enslavement of millions of human beings in the Americas. We also acknowledge ethnic discrimination in our current social structures here in the United States and across the world. Unfortunately, much of systemic racism (in all of its forms) traces theories back to a corrupt interpretation of the sons and grandsons of Noah in the Book of Genesis.

As a church, Ray Of Hope Church Of Our Lord Jesus Christ, Incorporated, founded in 1983, we walk into the hall of this dialogue and experience and sit down in the seats to take our part in the conversation and the action the Gospels require of us. 

Leader -1: Please be seated. Today, we light our Candle Of Hope to celebrate our faith and trust in the promised "Blessed Hope," also known as "The Rapture," the return of Christ who will transform the living faithful and raise all to new life. Jesus said: (John 5:25 and Titus 2:13)

ALL: "I am the resurrection and the life. Those who believe in me, even though they die, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die." (John 11:25, 26)

Leader -2: In 1983, Ray Of Hope Church was started in part to form a unique ministry to persons affected by and infected with HIV/AIDS. Forty-one years later, some churches, religions, and even some countries continue rejecting the sick, lonely, and dying people with HIV/AIDS who need spiritual guidance. + Sermon

Ray Of Hope Church teaches the same Christian faith of ancient ecumenical consensus. St. Vincent of Lerins, a fifth-century monk and theologian, described it as

"what has been believed always, everywhere, and by all."

2 Corinthians 4:5-6 ⁵ For we do not proclaim ourselves; we proclaim Jesus Christ as Lord and ourselves as your slaves for Jesus's sake. ⁶ For it is the God who said, "Light will shine out of darkness," who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Christ. (NRSVUE)

During the Season of Lent the Lectionary goes through the Covenants. Today's first reading, Genesis Chapter 9, verses 8 - 15 is the Covenant with Noah. The notes on the Noahic Covenant are on page 189 of the NKJV Scofield, III study Bible. The notes are racist and add much to the meaning of the text.

Unfortunately, it is from the interpretation of these verses that we have the tradition of justification for slavery of dark-skinned people by light-skinned people.

The four schools of eschatology have four different answers for what the Bible has to say regarding being and time, past, present, and future. The four schools of eschatology are symbolic, amillennial, postmillennial, and premillennial. The symbolic school claims a "higher criticism" of the biblical text and concludes that the collected writings in the Bible is all too confusing since

this school tell us there is nothing of value to glean from apocalyptic literature.

Last Sunday, 2-11-24 the second reading included Peter writing about the Transfiguration reading years after the experience, much later. On the mountain of Transfiguration, Jesus is confirmed to be this very personage written about in the Book of Daniel, Chapter 7, by the presence of Moses, Elijah, and Jesus himself in a state of glory. The Apostles, Peter, James, and John, are allowed to see into the Heavenly realm and see Jesus, Moses, and Elijah glorified and sanctified. With this mountain-top experience, Peter, James, and John have confirmation that Jesus is the Son of God. Then God clearly says, "Listen to Him."

The letter of Peter is further proof that the Transfiguration is a historical event.

Second Peter, chapter 1, verses 16-19. You will find this on page 236 in the back of the 1989 NRSV Bible. This is the 2021 updated version. Here begins the reading:

Eyewitnesses of Christ's Glory

¹⁶ For we did not follow <u>cleverly devised myths</u> when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we had been <u>eyewitnesses of his majesty</u>. ¹⁷ For he received honor and glory from God the Father when that voice was conveyed to him by the Majestic Glory, saying, "This is my Son, my Beloved,^[a] with whom I am well pleased." ¹⁸ <u>We ourselves heard this voice come from</u> <u>heaven, while we were with him on the holy mountain</u>.


