

Notice the people identified Jesus as establishing the "NEW TEACHING." Jesus is the dean of the new school of Theology. To look to any other is to abandon the Theology Jesus was sent here to establish. There is nothing else to look for; He is the Image of the Invisible God....(Colossians 1:15 + canticle)

These are all epiphanies. All of them require a response from us.

Today's Gospel, February 4, 2024, Jesus heals many, Jesus preaches, and people throng to him to hear him. Jesus heals the mother-in-law of Peter. This is an epiphany. ***NOTE*** The Denomination, which claims to be Peter's direct succession, mandates a single and unmarried life for its clergy, though not all. Peter himself was married. So, why claim a succession back to Peter and yet insist your clergy not be married?

Whitfield, 41, became a Catholic priest in 2012 through the Pastoral Provision, a set of rules crafted by Pope John Paul II in 1980 that gives married Episcopal priests who have converted to Catholicism the chance to apply for ordination in the Catholic church.

The process, which can take years, includes everything from psychological interviews to exams on Catholic theology and, in the end, a special dispensation from the pope.

The convert priests see themselves as narrow exceptions to centuries of Catholic rules, part of a drive in the Catholic church to reunite with some branches of Anglicanism. They live with special restrictions, including that they cannot become bishops. They also cannot remarry if their wives die, and must spend the rest of their priestly lives as celibates." (END OF ARTICLE QUOTATION)

Finally, next Sunday, February 11, we end this season with the Transfiguration, and now we hear the voice of God saying, "This is my beloved Son with whom I am well pleased; LISTEN TO HIM."

These Gospel readings demand a season of epiphanies if one emphasizes the divinity of Christ. The six weeks of the Season of Epiphany is why we are keeping the Gold color out and not going to Green; this is not "Ordinary Time." Though the name is from the use of ordinal numbers for this season, it has been practiced as a less important time. At Ray Of Hope Church, we take these six weeks to focus on the readings showing us God proving who the Beloved Son is, not for Jesus but for us, you and me. This is all done so we can hear and respond.

Revelation and Response; R&R.

If time permits, go back to the readings.


