+ The Candle Of Hope



Last week, the readings related to the Dispensation of the Law.

I thought of calling these readings a dispensation of circumcision of the heart.

Or the circumcision of our will and our choices.

READ Saint John Chrysostom (c.347-407) was Ordained a deacon in 381 at 34 years old, a priest in 386, and the Patriarch of Constantinople in 397.

Our second reading is found in Paul's second letter to the Corinthians, chapter 5, verses 14 through 21. You will find this on page 181 in the back, the second testament of the NRSV Bible. I will be reading from the Inclusive Bible. Here begins the reading:

14 The love of Christ overwhelms us whenever we reflect on this: that if one person has died for all, then all have died. 15 The reason Christ died for all was so that the living should live no longer for themselves but for Christ, who died and was raised to life for them. 16 And so from now on, we don't look on anyone in terms of mere human judgment. Even if we did once regard Christ in these terms, that is not how we know Christ now. 17 And for anyone who is in Christ, there is a new creation. The old order has passed away; now everything is new! 18 All of this is from God, who ransomed us through Christ—and made us ministers of that reconciliation. 19 This means that

through Christ, the world was fully reconciled again to God, who didn't hold our transgressions against us, but instead entrusted us with this message of reconciliation. ²⁰ This makes us Christ's ambassadors, as though God were making the appeal directly through us. Therefore we implore you in Christ's name: be reconciled to God. ²¹ For our sake, God made the One who was without sin to be sin, so that by this means we might become the very holiness of God.

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

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Treasurer's Report for the month of February 2025

I want to thank you all for your donations for the month of February as we endeavor to complete the work that God has given us here. If any of you ever have any questions that come up concerning the finances, please, always feel free to contact me. My cell number is 607-346-4240.

General Fund opening balance at the beginning of February was \$1,263.71. Donations to the General Fund for the month were \$3,049.82. This included special donations of \$60.00 towards Appointed Pastor's self- employment tax. Pastoral compensation of \$2,060.00 was paid. The following payments were made from this account: Verizon \$62.47, I was reimbursed \$26.49 for grape juice purchase, \$143.34 was transferred to savings towards Appointed Pastor's self-employment tax and \$32.82 came out of the account for Paypal charges. After these were paid the balance of this account at the end of the month was \$1,988.41.

Building Fund opening balance was \$1,374.29. Donations to the Building Fund were as follows: Brother Shawn Benedict \$648.00, Kaiden Benedict \$400.00, Lisa Frost \$330.00 towards the annual cellular fire alarm invoice and Wayne and Glenn \$100.00. I transferred \$1,256.27 from the Building Improvement fund. Bills that came out of the fund this month was the Credit Card bill with Key Bank of \$56.77, electric \$276.92, gas bill \$253.00, Liability Insurance \$275.60, Accessibility Solutions (for elevator maintenance)

Savings (Council) Account opening balance \$526.99. I transferred \$143.34 for Appointed Pastor Self Employment tax to this account. 5 Star bank took \$5.00 out for a paper statement fee, which I have now changed to all electronic statements. The ending balance is \$665.33.

There were no undeposited funds for February.

Balances in the cash accounts as of today, March 27, 2025:

General fund: \$2,362.26, Building Fund: \$1,802.82, Building Improvement fund: \$864,36 and the Savings (Council) Account: \$688.65, which includes \$250.00 of Appointed Pastor SE tax which will be paid quarterly before it's due date of April 15th.

Subject: New area of concern that has surfaced regarding website

Dear Members and Friends, to keep you informed, we wanted to share with you that we have been notified by an organization called PicRights International Inc. that we alleged used images that were copyrighted on our website in 2021. This is a new area of concerns that we are facing as Pic Rights operates on behalf of the Associated Press and EPA photographers. We are being told that this is a copyright violation and were initially fined a total of \$1,875 for 5 images. The images used were all linked to an article that was posted for educational and religious education purposes. They in essence were part of the article.

Although we believe all rules of the Fair Use Act were applied and materials well sourced on our website, I was told that those rules of engagement do not apply to the use of these images on our website. Br. Benedict has worked tirelessly and continues to do so to ensure everything we do is in compliance and we thank him for all the hours he has donated to this.

The council is 100% committed to getting clarification on what the rules of engagement are and putting into place compliance with those rules if indeed they are not what we believe to be the case so this is not a recurring issue. We have spoken with a friend of the church who provided us with some attorneys that specialize in Intellectual property and copyright laws. We are moving forward with contacting an attorney to represent us.

We were able to negotiate an offer with PicRights due to our status as a Not for Profit Religious Corporation as well as the impact such a stiff fee would have on our church finances. The reduced fee is a 60% reduction to \$750. We were given a due date of February 14, 2025 to take advantage of the negotiated rate. We will be speaking with an attorney prior to that time to see if this is the best course of action for us at this time and how to proceed in the future.
