The bell rings out 39 joyful rings, in contrast to tolling the bell in single rings. The 39 joyful rings honor the 39 lashes Jesus endured, and we now celebrate victory and gratitude for our Salvation. "The chastisement for our peace was upon Him, And by His stripes, we are healed." (Isaiah 53:5) We ring the bell before worship and Bible Enrichment sessions. Listen carefully and see if you can hear all 39 rings.

Those viewing at home may light a special candle and bring it to your table. Now, everyone, please join me and recite these words of Jesus to celebrate the Truth they promise us. Jesus said: (John 5:25 and Titus 2:13)

ALL: "I am the resurrection and the life. Those who believe in me, even though they die, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die." (John 11:25, 26)

Leader -2: In 1983, Ray Of Hope Church was started in part to form a unique ministry to persons affected by and infected with HIV and AIDS and to extend a radical welcome to all people to worship with us. Our witness

to God's unconditional love for everyone is as relevant today as it was in 1983. Here we are forty-one years later, and still, some churches, religions, and, yes, even some countries continue rejecting the sick, lonely, and dying people with HIV and AIDS who deserve comfort and spiritual guidance.






¹⁹ Some members of the Jewish party from Antioch and Iconium arrived and won the people over. They stoned Paul and dragged him out of the town, leaving him there for dead. ²⁰ His students quickly formed a circle about him, and before long he got up and went back into the town. The next day, he left with Barnabas for Derbe. ²¹ After they had proclaimed the Good News in that town and made numerous disciples, they retraced their steps to Lystra and Iconium first, then to Antioch. ²² They put fresh heart in the disciples there, encouraging them to persevere in their faith. "We all have to experience many hardships," they said, "before we enter the kindom of God." ²³ In each church they appointed elders and, with prayer

and fasting, commended them to God, in whom they had put their faith. ²⁴ Then they passed through Pisidia and came to Pamphylia. ²⁵ After proclaiming the word in Perga, they went down to Attalia. ²⁶ From there they sailed back to Antioch, where they had first been commended to the grace of God for the work they had now completed. ²⁷ On their arrival, they assembled the church and gave an account of all that God had done with them, and of how they had opened the door of faith to the Gentiles. ²⁸ Then they spent some time there with the disciples.

Today is the Fifth of seven Sundays in the season of the Resurrection,

2025. Why is it a season? Our Lord was seen in the resurrection body multiple times during the 40 days between the morning of the resurrection and the morning of the ascension into Paradise. To give us a real-time sense of the time God allowed people to see, touch, feel, eat with, sleep with, and talk to Jesus in his resurrection body, the church calendar counts out these 40 days. It was a long period of time, and it was loving grace that God did this for us. May 29, Thursday, is Ascension Day. Then ten days later is the celebration of Pentecost, for a total of fifty days. The Jewish Community also celebrates these fifty days.

I decided to look further into this to see if this might be where we Christians derive our Great Fifty Days from, from Resurrection to Pentecost. The answer is yes, it is.

There is a Jewish Tradition of counting 50 days that is Biblical. This year it started at nightfall on Sunday, April 13, our Palm Sunday, and will end at nightfall on June 1, Pentecost Sunday. This year, our worship calendars are almost lined up.

The seven-weeks between <u>Passover</u> and <u>Shavuot</u> is known as "the omer" period. An <u>omer</u> ("sheaf") was an ancient measure of grain, and refers to the barley offering brought to the Temple on the second day of Passover. Starting on that day, the Torah instructs: "you shall count off seven weeks. They must be complete: you must count until the day after the seventh week – 50 days" (Leviticus 23:15-16). The festival of Shavuot is observed on the 50th day.

The counting of the Omer (*S'firat HaOmer*), which lasts for 49 days, takes place at night, commencing on the second night of Pesach. Those who "count the Omer" recite a blessing each night of the 50-day period:

ָבָרוּךְ אַתָּה יְיָ אֱלֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶךְ הָעוֹלָם, אֲשֶׁר קַדְשֶׁנוּ בְּמִצְוֹתִיו, וְצִוְּנוּ עַל סְפִירַת הָעְמֶר.

Baruch atah Adonai Eloheinu melech ha-olam asher kid'shanu b'mitzvotav vitzivanu al s'firat ha-omer.

Blessed are You, Adonai our God, Ruler of the universe, who sanctifies us with mitzvot, and commands us concerning the counting of the Omer.

The end of the 50 days is known as the festival of Shavuot. Take time to read the first page of this website, and see that the Rabbis have changed the name and purpose of this festival over the centuries. It is referred to by four different Hebrew names, indicating different spiritual purposes, with four sets of Scripture verses.

Two Traditions have survived. The first Tradition is the celebration of the giving of the Torah on the 50th day. The other Tradition marks the beginning of the summer wheat harvest as the wheat is sprouting and showing that it will grow at this time. When the language of common usage moved to Greek in some regions of the world, the Hebrew Scriptures were translated into Greek. This work is known as the Septuagint and includes the Apocryphal books. It was created by Greek-speaking Jews in Alexandria, Egypt, in the 3rd and 2nd centuries BC and was used in the early Christian Churches. Most scholars set the dates for this work as beginning in 250 BC and finishing in about 100 BC. In Greek, this festival is known as Pentecost, which adds up to the great 50 days.

The Christian Church has used the word Pentecost ever since the writing of the Septuagint was adopted as the official Scriptures for Greek speaking, i.e. Gentile Christians.

We are in the Great Fifty Days which the Christian Church celebrates from sunset the beginning of the feast of the First Fruits.

But now Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who are asleep. For since by a man came death, by a man also came the resurrection of the dead. For as in Adam all die, so also in Christ all will be made alive. But each in his own order: Christ the first fruits, after that those who are Christ's at his coming... (1 Corinthians 15:20-23)

The three major spring feasts of the Law of Moses are Passover, First Fruits, and Pentecost.

The feast of First Fruits is observed on the third day after Passover. The instructions for it are found in Leviticus 23:9-14. The observance of this ritual brought the promise of a greater harvest to come.

God raising Jesus from the dead was not just a display of God's power over death. God raised Jesus on the third day after Passover, the Feast of the First

Fruits. It was not accidental. Jesus is the "first fruits of the dead." Jesus is the promise of the greater harvest to come, namely through Jesus, all will be made alive: "Christ, the first fruits, after that those who are Christ's at his coming.." (1 Cor. 15:20-23)

Jesus was buried at Passover and raised by God on the third day, the feast of the First Fruits. As the Jewish men were going up the steps of the Temple to bring the acceptable offerings for first fruits according to Leviticus 23:9-14, Jesus was ascending to the Throne of God, the Tabernacle made without hands, to present Himself as the final acceptable offering. (John 20:17; Hebrews 9:11). This is the significance of "on the THIRD DAY" Jesus was raised from the dead.

In the early morning of the resurrection Jesus told Mary Magdalene she could not touch him as he had not yet ascended "to my Father, and your Father, to my God, and your God." (John 20:17). HOWEVER, that night Jesus shows him his physical body, and from that time on they were allowed to touch him and know that he was not a ghost. (John 20:19 and following). He had been to the Throne of God that day and presented Himself as the First Fruit, the final offering to God.

1st reading today, we see Paul is beaten in the streets for betraying the faithful Jewish believers. Trying to see it from their point of view, Saul of Tarsus was a great teacher in Judaism. When he started proclaiming this new apostasy, claiming the son of Joseph of Nazareth to be a God or a Son of God, that was too much for them to handle, so they came after him to try to beat some sense into Saul, who took a new name, Paul. Notice the reading says Paul had disciples who circled him to protect him. The next day, Paul was on the road again, for Jesus. Here we see the Apostles beginning to set up a structure for order in the Christian assemblies. The Apostles appoint the Elders.

Our Psalm 145 continues last week's Psalm, now with the response, Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia. This is an excellent prayer for you to pray at home. We have already noted these psalms, and the readings from Revelation show us Creation is at worship. Two of my favorite verses in Psalm are verses 10 and

11: "All your creatures shall thank you, O Lord, and your friends shall repeat their blessing. They shall speak of the glory of your reign and declare your might, O God." I realize that one's accent words in these sentences can give different meanings. I like thinking the "creatures" are thanking the Lord and speaking of the Lord's glory. Then, we are described as God's "friends" who "repeat their blessing." It could be read that we are repeating the praise of Creation; creatures are first, and we are second. I like that

In the Second Reading in Revelation, John is consoled to be shown that God will prevail with a New Heavens and a New Earth and be at home with God in Creation forever.

Gospel: This reading returns to Holy Thursday night on the way to the Garden of Gethsemane. John 13:34-35 "I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. ³⁵ By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

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Treasurer's Report for the month of March 2025

General Fund opening balance at the beginning of March was \$1,988.41. Donations to the General Fund for the month were \$3,274.11. This included special donations of \$20.00 toward the cost of the Inquiries class notebooks. I also transferred in \$36.27 from the Building Fund. Payments out of this account were: Pastoral compensation of \$2,060.00, Verizon \$62.47, Corning Pride application fee of \$50.00, a reimbursement to Brother for \$184.08 (which was coded to the following accounts: Fire Alarm Maintenance for CO2 detector \$36.27, copy expenses for notebooks for inquiries class \$81.42, wine and grape juice purchase from Ash Wednesday service \$66.39) Appointed Pastor Self Employment tax was moved to saving in the amount of \$23.32 and Paypal charges for the month were \$30.26. After these were paid the balance of this account at the end of the month was \$2,888.66. There was undeposited funds in this account of \$1.99 and I recorded a \$90.00 Gift in Kind from Wayne and Glenn for dry cleaning of the choir robes.

Building Fund opening balance was \$1,481.44. Donations to the Building Fund were as follows: Brother Shawn Benedict \$648.00, Ian and Christina \$450.00 and Wayne and Glenn \$200.00. Bills that came out of the fund this month was the Credit Card bill with Key Bank of \$56.27, electric \$276.92, gas bill \$253.00, Liability Insurance \$275.60, water bill \$78.56 and I transferred \$36.27 to the General Fund to repay that account for the CO2 detector. Ending balance of this fund was \$1,802.82. Undeposited funds in this account was \$50.00 from Katrina Lourdiane.

Building Improvement Fund opening balance on this account was \$864.36. There was no activity on this account so the ending balance is \$864.36

Savings (Council) Account opening balance \$665.33. \$23.32 was transferred into this account from the General Fund towards the Appointed Pastor's self- employment tax.

The ending balance on this account was \$688.65. \$250.00 of this is the self- employment tax.

I wanted to add just a few additional notes.

I sincerely thank you all for your generous donations. God is and has been so faithful to us. Every gift the Church receives is so greatly appreciated as we press on to do what God has called us to do. You can see from the above report what is involved concerning finances alone to make the Church function. Our income for the first three months of 2025 totals \$14,204.20. Our expenses for the first three months of the year were \$12,654.39. I'm holding \$330.00 which was given for a specific expense, so figuring that in, we have a difference of \$1,219.81 of income over expenses. We are clearing expenses by about \$400 per month.

The credit card balance as of the last statement is \$2,399.94 with a credit limit of \$4,000.00. Our payment is \$53.00 a month with \$29.00 of that being interest.

As of today, April 10,2025. The balance in the General Fund is \$1,878.66, Building Fund \$1,232.30, Building Improvement Fund \$864.36 and Savings (Council) Account \$438.65.

Both NYSEG bills (electric & gas) have been paid this month in addition to the liability insurance and the Self-Employment tax payment due 4/15 has been paid. Also, the Real Property Tax Exemption Form has been completed and mailed in.

Subject: New area of concern that has surfaced regarding website

Dear Members and Friends, to keep you informed, we wanted to share with you that we have been notified by an organization called PicRights International Inc. that we alleged used images that were copyrighted on our website in 2021. This is a new area of concerns that we are facing as Pic Rights operates on behalf of the Associated Press and EPA photographers. We are being told that this is a copyright violation and were initially fined a total of \$1,875 for 5 images. The images used were all linked to an article that was posted for educational and religious education purposes. They in essence were part of the article.

Although we believe all rules of the Fair Use Act were applied and materials well sourced on our website, I was told that those rules of engagement do not apply to the use of these images on our website. Br. Benedict has worked tirelessly and continues to do so to ensure everything we do is in compliance and we thank him for all the hours he has donated to this.

The council is 100% committed to getting clarification on what the rules of engagement are and putting into place compliance with those rules if indeed they are not what we believe to be the case so this is not a recurring issue. We have spoken with a friend of the church who provided us with some attorneys that specialize in Intellectual property and copyright laws. We are moving forward with contacting an attorney to represent us.

We were able to negotiate an offer with PicRights due to our status as a Not for Profit Religious Corporation as well as the impact such a stiff fee would have on our church finances. The reduced fee is a 60% reduction to \$750. We were given a due date of February 14, 2025 to take advantage of the negotiated rate. We will be speaking with an attorney prior to that time to see if this is the best course of action for us at this time and how to proceed in the future.

I am bringing this to the attention of all our members and friends to first make you aware of the concern. Secondly, if you would like to assist with website maintenance expenses, please contact our treasurer Ed Askins. Any amount of donation would be beneficial. Also, if you know anyone who has copyright law experience that could help us moving forward, please let any council member know. We will keep you informed of any updated developments.

As always, we thank you for your generosity and support as we endeavor to do God's work together and give God glory and praise.
