**Bells 1<sup>st</sup> ring.** Once the bell rings please find your seat and spend the next few minutes in silent prayer. Please refrain from conversations as these disturb those trying to pray.

The St. Francis and St. Clare of Assisi bell at Ray Of Hope Church, 380 W. 1<sup>st</sup> St. in Elmira, NY was a gift from Michael Quinnell of Syracuse, NY in September 2005. The bell rings out 39 joyful rings, in contrast to tolling the bell in single rings. The 39 joyful rings are in honor of the 39 lashes Jesus endured that we now celebrate in victory and gratitude for our salvation. "The chastisement for our peace was upon Him, And by His stripes we are healed." (Isaiah 53:5) We always ring the bell before worship and Bible Enrichment sessions. 
**Pastor:** We begin in the name of God, Christ Our Saviour, and the Holy Spirit.

**Pastor: (\*\*introduction of the theme of the day\*) St. Benedict**



Benedict was born in Nursia, today called Norcia, Italy in about 480 a.d. His family was financially secure and so he lived in the cities and attended educational institutions. He was an academic for sure but he experienced a deep desire to live for God and Christ alone. Taking the example of monks before him, he took this desire quite literally and went to live a solitary life in a cave to give

himself completely to God. This was not uncommon in the early church. Soon people started coming to him for spiritual direction and finally, after some time a group of men asked him to lead their religious community as their abbot in all matters of the Christian life. Along the way, this community he was elected to lead decided he was too strict and they attempted to poison him twice. First, they poisoned his drink. However, when Benedict prayed a prayer over the drink the cup shattered. After that, he left the group and went back to his cave on Mt Subiaco. Later a jealous priest attempted the second time and tried to poison him with poisoned bread. When Benedict prayed a blessing over the bread a raven suddenly swept in and took the bread. There were many additional miracles during his life and interaction with other people.

His twin sister, Scholastica, was also interested in Religious Life and she started a women's branch of dedication. Eventually, Benedict formed twelve such houses of people living in community for Christ. Again, this was common in the early story of Christianity.

In the year 530 Benedict founded the great Benedictine monastery Monte Cassino which is still operational and is on a hilltop between Rome and Naples. It is at Monte Cassino that he writes his famous Rule for Monasteries. Some scholars believe it may have been written as early as about 516. This is one of the greatest pieces of religious literature ever written in the era of the Church.

Please keep in mind the Reformation does not happen until 1519, over 900 years after the life of Benedict. Even the first division in the church between East and West does not happen until 1053, some five hundred years later. St. Benedict is therefore a Christian saint, not a specifically Roman Catholic Saint.

Some main points we can take away from his Rule For Monasteries are to live a Christocentric life while here on earth. Do everything, all things for Christ. Pray and labor is his motto, ora et labora. In his day monks dedicated 8 hours a day to sleep, 8 hours to prayer, and 8 hours to work. In his communities all members are equal. In the Benedictine house, all sit around the central symbol of Christ, the Altar.

All seats are equal. The only thing that distinguishes one from another person is the service provided, such as the place to read aloud, or the place to play the piano, and such. Other than one's service, there is no distinction. We are all one in Christ.

He and his sister died in close timing. He died of fever it is said. They are buried side-by-side at Monte Cassino.

Thousands of Christians follow the Benedictine way of Christianity all over the world today. When World Communion Sunday was held at New Beginnings UMC years ago, Rev. Arthur Reed introduced Ray Of Hope as the Benedictine Christian Church. It was unexpected but very touching and quite humbling. I have remembered this and often thought about what kind of call it was to our better selves. I think it fits us quite nicely, actually.

The Gospel today reminds us to go out and tell everyone about Christ. It also is one of the significant Gospel readings that show Jesus had opportunities to talk about the so-called "sin of Sodom" if it were about homosexuality He would have done so.

Finally, today I am starting a special series on the story of the Church as seen through the seven letters to the seven churches in the Book of Revelation.

(John 5:25)

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**+ Thoughts on Today's Gospel.** The rejection of the Gospel of Jesus is a very serious offense against God. Stop and consider the widescale rejection of the Gospel of Jesus on a worldwide basis. The lists of the rationale for rejecting the Gospel are endless, so it seems. However, Christ is quite certain there is a judgment for rejection of His Gospel. There are similar sending to preach stories in Matthew 10:1-42 and Luke 9:1-6, and sending seventy disciples in Luke 10:1-12. These may be four versions the same event or different events in these Gospel citations. In two of them; Matthew 10:15 and Luke 10:12 Jesus goes beyond simply saying "it will count as a testimony against them" as He says in Mark 6:12 and Luke 9:5. In Matthew 10:15 and Luke 10:12 Jesus says the town that rejects the messenger of His Gospel will receive a more severe judgment, and thus it will be "more tolerable for the land of Sodom and Gomorrah in the day of judgment...." Clearly, Jesus is not to be shelved alongside other great thinkers and shakers of society, as just one more great teacher in the Human Race. Clearly, Jesus is declaring rejection of His Gospel to be one of the most severe errors any people can make, ever.

Second to this, is the remarkable opportunities Jesus had to discuss same-sex activity, and the certainty of eternal damnation for those who participate in it, if that is really the "sin of Sodom and Gomorrah" as we are told it is.

What we call homosexuality is not the subject of the “sin of Sodom” according to these Gospel citations. Rejection of the Gospel of Jesus Christ is the true “sin of Sodom” and rejection of the messenger who comes as a stranger to the locale and proclaims the Gospel of Christ is the “sin of Sodom.” Today’s Gospel reading follows on last Sunday where we read in Deuteronomy 10:19 “You shall also love the stranger, for you were strangers in the land of Egypt.” So, another aspect of the “sin of Sodom” is inhospitality to the stranger, and specifically the stranger who is bringing you the Word of God. Many commentators have concluded the institutional church is the greatest “sodomite” of all time as it has firmly rejected the full Gospel of Christ and those who have proclaimed it, especially with regard to rejecting people of sexual orientation and gender expressions.

## + Second Reading

**+ Sermon: Series: The state of the Church according to the seven letters to the seven churches in the Book of Revelation.**



**INTRODUCTION 14 points of Notice**

**1) Rev. 1:1** <sup>1</sup> The Revelation of Jesus Christ, which God gave Him to show His servants—things which must shortly take place.

The purpose of the book is to completely unveil who Jesus is and explain the certain consummation of all things up until and including the final judgment.

**2) Rev. 1:1b,2** And He sent and signified *it* by His angel to His servant John, <sup>2</sup> who bore witness to the word of God, and to the testimony of Jesus Christ, to all things that he saw.

God gave the book to Jesus who then sent it by an angel to John the Apostle who has written it for the church. John has written everything he experienced regarding the word of this angel and the experience of the vision.

**3) Rev. 1:3** <sup>3</sup> Blessed *is* he who reads and those who hear the words of this prophecy, and keep those things which are written in it; for the time *is* near.

This book is so important that there is a special blessing is reserved for those who spend the time to read, hear, and believe words here.

Blessed also means profound happiness or internal joy. Jesus told us when we know the truth it will set us free.

**4) Greeting the Seven Churches<sup>4</sup>** John, to the seven churches which are in Asia:

There were seven literal churches with which John was familiar. The Book of Revelation was written about 63 years after the day of Pentecost. “It is suggested that they also represent the seven basic divisions of church history. A study of history reveals that the Church has gone through seven basic periods or stages.” (Page 35 Revelation Unveiled Copyright © 1999 by Tim LaHaye. Hereafter referred to as Revelation Unveiled.)

These churches did exist at the time of John’s writing. At the same time they represent “the entire church through seven types of local churches which shall exist throughout the dispensation...” (Revelation Unveiled, pg. 36) These churches also prefigure “seven aspects of the professing church which would successfully rise into prominence before Christ’s second coming.” (Revelation Unveiled, pg. 36)

**5) Rev. 1:4a:** Grace to you and peace from Him who is and who was and who is to come,

Reference to the Trinity, but also Christ alone.

**6) Rev. 1:4c:** and from the seven Spirits who are before His throne, “The ‘seven spirits’ is a reference to the sevenfold work of the Spirit as revealed in Isaiah 11:2..” (Revelation Unveiled, pg 29) “Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit” at “Confirmation”: Spirit of the Lord, Spirit of Wisdom, understanding, counsel, power or fortitude, knowledge, fear (respect) of the Lord – piety.

**7) Rev 1:5-7<sup>5</sup>** and from Jesus Christ, the faithful witness, the firstborn from the dead, and the ruler over the kings of the earth.

To Him who loved us and washed us from our sins in His own blood,<sup>6</sup> and has made us kings and priests to His God and Father, to Him *be* glory and dominion forever and ever. Amen.

<sup>7</sup> Behold, He is coming with clouds, and every eye will see Him, even they who pierced Him. And all the tribes of the earth will mourn because of Him. Even so, Amen.

Note, even those who pierced him; Zechariah 12:10

<sup>10</sup> “And I will pour on the house of David and on the inhabitants of Jerusalem the Spirit of grace and supplication; then they will look on Me whom they pierced. Yes, they will mourn for Him as one mourns for *his* only son, and grieve for Him as one grieves for a firstborn.

**8) Rev. 1:8** Jesus speaks:

<sup>8</sup> “I am the Alpha and the Omega, *the* Beginning and *the* End,” says the Lord, “who is and who was and who is to come, the Almighty.”

**9) Rec 1:9-11 Vision of the Son of Man**

<sup>9</sup> I, John, both your brother and companion in the tribulation and kingdom and patience of Jesus Christ, was on the island that is called Patmos for the word of God and for the testimony of Jesus Christ. <sup>10</sup> I was in the Spirit on the Lord’s Day, and I heard behind me a loud voice, as of a trumpet, <sup>11</sup> saying, “I am the Alpha and the Omega, the First and the Last,” and, “What you see, write in a book and send *it* to the seven churches <sup>[h]</sup>which are in Asia: to Ephesus, to Smyrna, to Pergamos, to Thyatira, to Sardis, to Philadelphia, and to Laodicea.”

The Apostle John is self-identifying and giving his word, this is his own testimony. He is testifying he heard Jesus order him to write down everything he was about to see and experience and send it to these seven churches.

**10) Rev, 1:12-13** <sup>12</sup> Then I turned to see the voice that spoke with me. And having turned I saw seven golden lampstands, <sup>13</sup> and in the midst of the seven lampstands *One* like the Son of Man, clothed with a garment down to the feet and girded about the chest with a golden band.

In verse twenty Jesus speaks and says the seven lampstands are the seven churches. There will also be seven stars and these too will be the seven churches according to Jesus. Jesus is in the midst of the churches just as he is today.

**11) Rev. 1:17-18** <sup>14</sup> His head and hair *were* white like wool, as white as snow, and His eyes like a flame of fire; <sup>15</sup> His feet *were* like fine brass, as if refined in a furnace, and His voice as the sound of many waters; <sup>16</sup> He had in His right hand seven stars, out of His mouth went a sharp two-edged sword, and His countenance *was* like the sun shining in its strength.

John is seeing the glorified body of Jesus, resurrected and ascended and perfectly glorified for all ages. The two-edge sword is a reference to the Book of Hebrews 4:12 “the word of God is living and all-efficient active and sharper than a two-edge sword able to pierce between the soul and spirit, the joints and marrow, judging the thoughts and intentions of the heart.” Also in Revelation 19:15 when He comes to rule on the earth and is met with the armies of the nations under the anti-christ he comes with a sharp two-edged sword coming from his mouth and with one word, slays all the works of the anti-christ.

Note these descriptions say LIKE not this is what it is.

**12) Rev. 1:17-18** <sup>17</sup> And when I saw Him, I fell at His feet as dead. But He laid His right hand on me, saying to me, “Do not be afraid; I am the First and the Last. <sup>18</sup> I *am* He who lives, and was dead, and behold, I am alive forevermore. Amen. And I have the keys of Hades and of Death.

Jesus: Do not be afraid! Jesus has the keys, not Peter, not any denomination, not any religion. Jesus has the keys. Jesus is Lord of the living and the dead. Romans 14:9 Jesus is alive forever!

**13) Rev. 1:19** <sup>19</sup> Write the things which you have seen, and the things which are, and the things which will take place after this.

This is the three-part division of the Book of Revelation: the things which you see, the vision – chapter 1, the things which are – the church age, Chapters 2&3, and the things which will take place after the church age, chapters 4 to the end.

**14) Rev. 1:20** <sup>20</sup> The mystery of the seven stars which you saw in My right hand, and the seven golden lampstands: The seven stars are the angels of the seven churches, and the seven lampstands which you saw are the seven churches.

With that verse we are done with the introduction and ready for the first church next week.

All we have to do is ask with a short prayer like this: "Oh God, give me the awareness to know you are with me in all these ways through the Holy Spirit, Amen."

Here is the verse in the Amplified Bible

Jesus taught, saying: "But I tell you the truth, it is to your advantage that I go away; for if I do not go away, the Helper (Comforter, Advocate, Intercessor-Counselor, Strengtheners, Standby) will not come to you; but if I go, I will send Him (the Holy Spirit) to you [to be in close fellowship with you]." John 16:7

Did you realize the Holy Spirit is with you to bring you all those actions of God? If we understand the Real Presence of God is with us in Christ through the powerful ministry of the Holy Spirit, we will experience more confidence, love of ourselves and our neighbors, and be able to feel better about our lived experience. You can have all this and more. Start with that simple prayer above.

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## WHO SHOULD RECEIVE HOLY COMMUNION, THE EUCHARIST, AT RAY OF HOPE CHURCH?

Everyone is invited to receive Holy Communion, also known as The Eucharist, The Lord's Table, or The Blessed Sacrament at Ray Of Hope Church Of Our Lord Jesus Christ, Inc.

It is not required that you be a member of this church or any other church, to receive Holy Communion at / or with Ray Of Hope Church.

This Holy Communion is the Table of Jesus Christ, who is really present among us. Jesus invites you to receive Him in this Eucharistic banquet. If this is your first time receiving The Blessed Sacrament, let us know before you receive or right after, so we might pray a special prayer of thanksgiving with you.

Unfortunately, through the centuries many institutional churches have established rules, teachings, and practices that would exclude people from Holy Communion. There has been an almost endless list of reasons to exclude people from the Blessed Sacrament. Yet, together, during the worship service, we recite the very words of Jesus, the Words of Institution, "This is my body. This is my blood," and we rehear Christ present with us saying: "Take this, all of you and eat; Take this all of you and drink" of this gift.

I have thought about this extensively and have decided to take these words "Take this, all of you.." as a command to the church to give, and bring, the Eucharistic Gift to everyone who will receive. This approach also requires us to teach people about this gift. I have stated in other places, **it is uniquely and deliberately the work of Christ in His Church** to offer the necessary education, guidance, and practices that help people

Last month the House passed the [Equality Act \(H.R. 5\)](#). For those unaware, this important legislation would amend existing civil rights laws, such as the *Civil Rights Act of 1964*, to include sexual orientation, and gender identity as protected characteristics under law. The bill also expands federal non-discrimination protections regarding discrimination based on race, color, national origin, **religion**, sex, sexual orientation or gender identity in public settings, and protects against sex-based discrimination in government services and federally-funded programs.

This week, the Senate held its first ever hearing on the [Equality Act](#) and as expected, the debate was heated. It seems opponents of the bill (Senate Republicans) are promoting [several misconceptions](#) about its purpose and scope which include:

- *“The Equality Act would destroy religious freedom in this country.”*
  - **NOT TRUE.** Freedom of religion is already protected by the First Amendment of the U.S. Constitution. Nothing in the *Equality Act* would change that. The bill simply extends those rights that most vulnerable groups are already afforded to those who have been denied them, such as the **LGBTQ community**. In fact, the bill actually protects freedom of religion by preventing the imposing of one’s religion upon another.
- *“The Equality Act will make athletics unfair for females.”*
  - **NOT TRUE.** Schools across the nation already have policies in place to ensure a level playing field for all students, and they are working. Additionally, except for a very small percentage, most students who participate in high school sports do not continue on with their athletic endeavours after high school. The possibility that perhaps one or two transgender students in an entire student body would ruin that opportunity for another is [almost nonexistent](#). *Title IX* is extremely important in regards to girls athletics, and the bottom line is that **nothing in**

the *Equality Act* changes that. Instead, we should be calling for increased funding for girls athletics.

- “The *Equality Act* will allow men to harass women in public restrooms.”
  - **NOT TRUE.** We already have laws in place to prevent such acts, and the *Equality Act* does nothing to change that. Additionally, **21 states** have had similar nondiscrimination laws on the books for decades now and they have worked, as there have been no increases in public safety incidents in bathrooms since they were codified.
