Andrea: Please be seated. Today, we light our Candle Of Hope to show by this action of lighting this candle again that we celebrate our faith and trust in the promised "Blessed Hope," also known as "The Rapture," the return of Christ who will transform the living faithful and raise all to new life. I invite you to say these words of Jesus again to celebrate the Truth they promise us. Jesus said: (John 5:25 and Titus 2:13)

ALL: "I am the resurrection and the life. Those who believe in me, even though they die, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die." (John 11:25, 26)

Leader -2: In 1983, Ray Of Hope Church was started in part to form a unique ministry to persons affected by and infected with HIV/AIDS. Our witness to God's love for all people is as relevant today as it was then. Here we are forty-one years later, and some churches, religions, and, yes, even some countries continue rejecting the sick, lonely, and dying people with HIV/AIDS who need spiritual guidance. In a letter we recently received from amfAR, The Foundation for AIDS Research, we learn every

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minute that someone somewhere contracts HIV; today, right now, think about it. In the year 2023, 1.5 million people became newly infected, and 650,000 people, including some from the United States, died of AIDS-related causes.

HIV/AIDS is still with us; therefore, at Ray Of Hope Church Of Our Lord Jesus Christ, we continue to read aloud over **110,000** names sewn into the AIDS Memorial Quilt to keep HIV/AIDS in the conscious prayers of people.

ALL: Christ, have mercy.

Leader -1: The Body of Christ, the Church, should lead society to

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celebrate all ethnicities, sexual orientations and gender expressions, and protect the freedom of all persons; Lord, have mercy.

ALL: Lord, have mercy.

Leader -1: Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the World; have mercy on us.

ALL: Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the World, grant us peace.

Pastor: We pray that all of God's people may one day be reunited in God's Kingdom without the loss of anyone. Therefore, we ask Almighty God to have mercy on all of us, forgive all our sins, and keep us in everlasting life.

ALL: Amen.






My reason for bringing these items up is not for politics. There was another group of 50,000 people meeting from Wednesday, July 17, through today, Sunday, July 21, in Indianapolis, IN, The 10th National Eucharistic Congress of 2024. When I realized these two events were overlapping, I wondered how this overlap would affect the National Eucharistic Congress; in short, it didn't. The Lucas Oil Stadium in Indianapolis has been nearly filled to capacity, with 50,000 every day and night this entire week. Participants went to Indianapolis as early as Monday, July 15, to start the registration process and move into their hotels for the week.

Between 1895 and 1941, there were nine National Eucharistic Congresses in the United States, a time in society when Catholics and Protestants frequently gathered in stadiums, parades, and the like to show their presence in society. There hasn't been a Eucharistic Congress in the USA in 83 years, meaning it is improbable that anyone present at this one this week was present at the Ninth National Eucharistic Congress held from June 23 to June 26, 1941, in Falcon Heights, Minnesota, at the Minnesota State Fairgrounds.

CORRECTION: Some people are still alive, and one is Paul Ditter, who was in the eighth grade and 13 years old at the 1941 Eucharistic Congress. Mr. Ditter is 93

Why do I mention the National Eucharistic Congress, which is finishing as we worship this morning? First, the Body of Christ is gathered right now, just as we gathered. Secondly, the Roman Catholic Bishops stepped out in faith when they called for this Congress two years ago. Life in 2024 is very different than in 1941; the time of the last E. C. and the Roman Church is very different. I would have wondered if I was on any planning committee for this event if it would attract enough people. Obviously, I was wrong even to question it. I stand amazed at this event's response around the Blessed Sacrament this week and even in competition with the GOP National Convention. I will say it appears to me that here, with this conference, there is a New Pentecost in the USA Roman Church, and I hope the shepherds foster this and grow it the way they did in the 1970s during the most recent Charismatic Renewal in the R.C. Church. It has happened again.

The RNC and the USA RCC called people away together for instruction and inspiration this week. Both organizations made this call from their leadership, their shepherds. Both organizations featured speakers and general convocation events every day and evening. Both organizations featured Music, Video, and all the latest Technology. Both organizations set their vision for the USA in the next few years.

In today's Gospel, Jesus called a teaching conference/convention for his Apostles first, and then if you read on in this Gospel, it was the next day that he taught the 15,000 or so without a sound system, and He used a substantial natural technology. I suspect there was supranatural (meaning above nature) assistance to ensure everyone heard what Jesus said.

Did I choose these readings for today? No. In fact, I didn't even look at them until Friday night. Once again, the Lectionary proves to be God-ordered and always on time.

What is the theme? First, God calls us aside from time to time so that we may receive and be open to instruction for the time, place, and circumstances we find ourselves in. Since the Scriptures are timeless, it doesn't seem to matter if we are in the years 24, 41, 1941, or 2024; those same texts will certainly speak to the moment and the future.

Here is the question for your prayerful consideration, meditation, discernment, and action plan. Many shepherds out here claim to know the road forward, and in our Country, Politicians and Clergy claim to be the leaders for the way forward. You and I must discern where the pieces of the Truth are and put them together as best we individually understand them, tell others, VOTE, and live accordingly. The times we are in are like no other. Guess what? No time at any time is ever a time like any other, for all time is new in Christ. So, we had better pay attention to what the Spirit is saying to the Body of Christ today and proclaim it to the mountaintops.

In Mark 6: 30-34

³⁰ The apostles gathered around Jesus and told him all that they had done and taught. ³¹ He said to them, "Come away to a deserted place all by yourselves and rest a while."

We all need to make time to step away, step apart, and sit with Jesus to listen to His instruction, which comes to us through the Word, the Sacraments, and the worship Community.

For many were coming and going, and they had no leisure even to eat. ³²

Yes, we have all been to that place where we have been so busy that there is hardly any time to eat! However, Jesus tells us to make time for Him to speak with us.

And they went away in the boat to a deserted place by themselves. ³³ Now many saw them going and recognized them, and they hurried there on foot from all the towns and arrived ahead of them.

The leadership met, and then people came from everywhere to participate. In both conventions that met this week, there were break-out sessions for the

leaders and the shepherds, who received more training on how to lead the general population. In both conventions, they went forth each evening and shared what they were discerning and working on in their leadership sessions. The people came by the thousands to both conventions.

³⁴ As he went ashore, he saw a great crowd, and he had compassion for them, because they were like sheep without a shepherd, and he began to teach them many things.

Jesus, seeing the crowds coming, had compassion on them, meaning He understood their desire, their situations, their suffering, and He related to them as an example to the Apostles to show them how they were to lead. Lead by listening, relating, empathizing, comforting, but lead with the confidence that Christ is with us.

The theme is how to Shepherd.

In the first reading, Jeremiah 23:1-6 God challenges those who shepherd the people in civil matters and religious matters. This reading is often understood as a warning to those with leadership in the Church, especially Pastors, Teachers, Evangelists, Deacons, Apostles, and Prophets.

23 Woe to the shepherds who destroy and scatter the sheep of my pasture! says the LORD. ² Therefore thus says the LORD, the God of Israel, concerning the shepherds who shepherd my people: It is you who have scattered my flock and have driven them away, and you have not attended to them.

In the Gospel Reading, Mark 6:34, when Jesus saw the crowd coming to listen, He discerned they were "like sheep without a shepherd." Jesus knew of the selfish ways of the civil and religious leaders of His day, of the past, and yes, of this very moment and into the future. His solution? He Himself will shepherd the people. HOW? Through is REAL PRESENCE with us, through us, and in us. He has promised to be with us to the end of the Age, and He is.

So I will attend to you for your evil doings, says the LORD.

In this verse, every leader in civil and religious society had better shudder and shake. A few weeks ago, I was trying to tell someone there were Scripture verses that indicate that the leaders in the Church will be held to a higher

standard for what we have taught, especially regarding doctrine, dogma, teachings, and practices. Being held to a higher standard is why the Vocational Ministry Training Program is not a short "to-do list" of things to earn a rubber stamp to make a person a "minister." Leadership in society (elected, appointed, or otherwise) or in the Church (elected, appointed, or otherwise) is a solemn commitment that has eternal ramifications that may bring one under eternal unfavorable judgment if one is intentionally misguiding the people and if that same person refuses to listen to the Voice of God, the intent being not to listen. Mistakes are one thing, even big mistakes that may last over periods of time, but intentionally directing the people toward an agenda that is not centered on the worship of the One and Only True God, the Son, and the Holy Spirit is deadly, eternally deadly for that person or persons in leadership.

³ Then I myself will gather the remnant of my flock out of all the lands where I have driven them, and I will bring them back to their fold, and they shall be fruitful and multiply. ⁴ I will raise up shepherds over them who will shepherd them, and they shall no longer fear or be dismayed, nor shall any be missing, says the LORD.

This prophecy is literally for the House of Israel, which is not today's subject. These verses are also metaphorical prophecies for all people of all time. Just think of how people have been driven this way and that by terrible governments, wars, churches, religions, philosophies, and all matters of theories from time to time. However, God is not mocked.

Galatians 6:7-10 NRSVUE

⁷ Do not be deceived; God is not mocked, for you reap whatever you sow. ⁸ If you sow to your own flesh, you will reap corruption from the flesh, but if you sow to the Spirit, you will reap eternal life from the Spirit. ⁹ So let us not grow weary in doing what is right, for we will reap at harvest time, if we do not give up. ¹⁰ So then, whenever we have an opportunity, let us work for the good of all and especially for those of the family of faith.

God had a plan to raise up Jesus in His first coming to the Earth, to establish the Church, and ultimately to return Jesus to the Earth to set up His Kingdom, which will be handed over to God at the end of the Kingdom Age.

The Righteous Branch of David

⁵ The days are surely coming, says the LORD, when I will raise up for David a righteous Branch, and he shall reign as king and deal wisely and shall execute justice and righteousness in the land. ⁶ In his days Judah will be saved, and Israel will live in safety. And this is the name by which he will be called: "The LORD is our righteousness."

Ephesians, Chapter 2, verses 13-18.

¹³ But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ. ¹⁴ For he is our peace; in his flesh he has made both into one

In Christ, through the Birth, Life, Cross, Death, Resurrection, and Ascension of this man Jesus, we are one with God and all of creation again forever, whether our flesh is dead or alive. Nothing can separate us from this Love. (see Romans 8:38-39)

SO NOW, we have to ask ourselves: how well are we doing as Church, and how well are we doing bringing the Gospel of Christ to our society.

Both the RNC and the 10th NEC that met this week, said things that agree with our Statement Of Purpose and some things that are in total disagreement.

You can believe whatever you want to place your eternal destiny on. You are free to vote on whatever leadership you wish to place the future of our United States of America on.

However, be informed, up to date, and ready for the personal end of your human life, which could come suddenly, and be prepared for the results of the election we will have in November of 2024.

Carefully choose your shepherds. And, to us who are Shepherds, be careful, be very careful where we get our information and guidance from, and what we pass on as Truth and the correct standards and practices, for we will be held accountable for how we have led, especially if it is in the Name of Jesus that we did so.


