Closing Gospel Acclamation



The readings are selected for our celebration of Membership today.

The First Reading: Proverbs, chapter 4, verse 10 - 13 King Solomon is passing on to his listeners the benefits of godly wisdom, and one of them is a long life. We understand the

Holy Spirit as the author of all such wisdom. Here, then, God is asking us to trust the Word for all it says on small matters; if you "walk" or if you "run" as well as every matter of life. We are told to hold on to Wisdom and instruction and to guard her, "for she is your life." Do note Wisdom is said to be "she" and "she is your life." The early church (roughly the first two hundred years) often referred to the Holy Spirit with feminine pronouns. Since Jesus said the Holy Spirit would guide the Church into all truth, John 16:13, truth was equated with wisdom, therefore, the Holy Spirit is the seat of all Wisdom. The Greek word for wisdom is sophia, a central piece of all Greek Hellenistic religion and philosophy. So, seek the Holy Spirit in the Word and hold on to Her, and your life will be lengthy and well.

The Second reading: 2 Timothy, chapter 2, verses 14 - 16 in the Jubilee Bible 2000 (JUB) Copyright © 2013, 2020, includes a traditional rendering of verse 15. In both the verses before it and after it, the warning is to avoid arguing over exact words, details, appearances, and we would include gossip, chatter, online noise, etc. As in the first reading, cling to the Word of God.

Now, the verse with the traditional rendering:

¹⁵ "Study to show thyself approved unto God, a workman that has nothing to be ashamed of, rightly dividing the word of truth."

This rendering became a banner theme of the Bible Prophecy Conference Movement of ca. 1870 to ca. 1919. This verse was embraced by nearly all theologians working on the renewal of Eschatology that began in 1850. Many, including Dake, Scofield, and Larkin, even named books using words from this verse, such as "Rightly Dividing the Word." In the first twenty years of the 20th Century, the debate over the Inspiration of Scripture and other articles of Doctrine was quite fierce, especially in the colleges, universities, and seminaries of the Northern States. Most Bible translations during and after this time of debate use alternate word choices such as:

¹⁵ Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved by him, a worker who has no need to be ashamed, rightly explaining the word of truth. (NRSVUE)

I selected this reading today knowing Ed has been carefully studying the Word and theologies during this time of discerning the choice for Membership, including "Rightly Dividing the Word" by C. I. Scofield.

Finally, the Gospel, John 14:18-21. Next to the Holy Scriptures, the most absolute defining quality that separates the Church from any other institution or organization on Planet Earth is the Doctrine of Real Presence. In this Gospel reading, as in many other verses, Jesus promises even after his physical human life He is and always will be truly present and with us. This Doctrine separates Christianity from every other Religion on Earth. He also

assures us the Holy Spirit lives in us in the verse preceding this reading:

John 14:17 ¹⁷ This is the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive because it neither sees him nor knows him. You know him because he abides with you, and he will be^[C] in^[d] you. (NRSVUE)

Jesus even promises we fully participate in the divine union that He shares with God and the Holy Spirit, a union so obvious we named it "The Trinity." In this Gospel Reading, Jesus includes all of us in that union when He explains the day was coming when the world would no longer see Him, but we would actually "see" Him and participate in the Divine Union of God:

John 14:20²⁰ On that day you will know that I am in my Father, and you in me, and I in you.

Our Testimony, Why We Are Here.

1) Last Sunday, we celebrated the victory of the Cross of Christ, God's Love to the World, in our lives. Despite all the hostile rhetoric from some Churches, Theologies, and Politics, we found a group of people at Ray Of Hope Church Of Our Lord Jesus Christ who openly testify the Bible and the Real Presence of Christ completely embrace us and empower us to be the Body Of Christ, the Church today, for real, in this very place and time we find ourselves.

I have been active in this church for thirty of the forty years of its ministry. I can see how church and society have sometimes shown and then withdrawn support for people of all sexual orientations and gender expressions over these forty years. The similarity to standing on the sandy beach to see, hear, and feel the waves of the active ocean water wash in and out, back and forth, reaching further in sometimes and not as far other times, with loud roaring sounds down to a slight trickling gives an illustration of the attitudes, understanding, progress, and backlash we have experienced.

Embracing the Bible, the Holy Scriptures, and the Sacraments is the unique reason Ray Of Hope is the church founded, fostered, and consistently supported by the LGBTQSIANE2ss+ Community of Central New York State. Ray Of Hope is the first Christian Church in Central, Upstate New York to publically testify the Bible does not condemn us. The founders and foundresses were standing on the shoulders of Rev. D. Sherwin Bailey, Fr. John J. McNeill, John Boswell, Rev. Troy Perry, and the literalist biblical interpreters looking behind the English translations to find the real meaning of the original biblical texts. Surprisingly to some, it is still the works of C. I. Scofield and most of the Bible Conference theologians of 1870 - 1919 (+) who are the most helpful to us with the bible text. We disagree with them on sexual expression, but their treatment of the misused texts

to condemn us is still some of the finest scholarship available today. During these last forty years, the academic profession has produced an immeasurable amount of studies, publications, courses, and degree programs to examine every knowable aspect of our lives, past, present, and predictable future. We have truly been blessed in the academy, church, and society. The Cross of Christ has triumphed in our lives.

There is an ancient Latin expression: Lex orandi, lex credendi, lex vivendi: "the law of what is prayed [is] the law of what is believed [is] the law of what is lived." This ancient Christian motto also shows the way the tools of the religion developed. The Order of Worship, the Liturgy was developed and established before the Creeds and before the approved books (canonical lists) were assembled into the Bible. Creeds, official Bibles, Church Law (By-laws and policies), and ethnic practices all developed after communal prayer.

The believers gathered in communal prayer, and this is where the Church of Jesus Christ began: Hear the book of Acts, chapter 2, verses 1 - 4 and 16 - 21.

The Coming of the Holy Spirit

2 When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. ² And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. ³ Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. ⁴ All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

¹⁶ No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel:

¹⁷ 'In the last days it will be, God declares,

that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh,

This reading in Acts, Chapter Two, is the first recorded act of the believers assembled for prayer on the first day of the Church of Jesus Christ. Christ's Church started with prayer, then sacraments - sacred moments when the work of the Holy Spirit was obvious with confession and forgiveness, healing, baptism, Christ's Eucharist, baptism in the Holy Spirit, prophecy, teaching, understanding, all of the gifts, always from the start there were caring ministries - the Gospel put into social action. This was followed by establishing order and ministry, and later came the establishment of approved books for Scripture and public reading and teaching.

Ray Of Hope Church also began with a worship service called by Mr. Ted Ewald and thirteen others in July of 1983. This first communal worship event of record was followed by other prayer services, classes on the Bible and the Church, social ministry, and caring for the sick and persecuted. Ray Of Hope has been a testimony church from the very first meeting. See the letter referenced: right click here.

Just as the first congregation on the first day of the Church gathered for worship as recorded in the Book of Acts, and just as the first people who started Ray Of Hope Church gathered for worship on their first day, so today, the first and most important thing we do as a church is pray together in communal prayer. From the prayer service, everything else grows out. Still, the first and most primary thing we do that separates us from social service agencies, department stores, hospitals and schools is we pray and worship together in communal worship of God. Our first priority as Members and Friends of Ray Of Hope Church is attending the public communal worship event on Sunday morning together.

3.10 Expectations of Members.

It is expected that Members attend regularly and specially called meetings of the Church membership and regularly attend worship services and other functions as health permits; further, each is expected to provide financial and volunteer help in support of the work of the Church and to be committed to growth in understanding and application of the Ray Of Hope Church Of Our Lord Jesus Christ "<u>Statement of Faith</u>: and <u>Statement of Purpose</u>."

There is so much more to say about our wonderful and unique testimony as a church, but time will not permit. Three additional defining points regarding our testimony as a Church of Jesus Christ:

Sacraments/Ordinances/Rituals and the structure of a well ordered Church can be an outstanding contribution to our lives as individuals and as a community.

2) Our Testimony is: separating the spoken and written rules of churches into the categories of Doctrine, Dogma, Teaching, and Practice; it is clear all matters of sexuality and gender managed by Denominations are teachings, not biblical doctrine.

3) Our Testimony is: after careful study of the original languages of the Scriptures and a working knowledge of how the institutional church has evolved in time and place, we are compelled to open all ministries to all persons and to facilitate this, we use inclusive language and we are sensitive in the design and presentations of our worship spaces to show this equality.





WHO SHOULD RECEIVE HOLY COMMUNION, THE EUCHARIST, AT RAY OF HOPE CHURCH?

Everyone may receive Holy Communion, also known as The Eucharist, The Lord's Table, or The Blessed Sacrament at Ray Of Hope Church Of Our Lord Jesus Christ, Inc.

You are not required to be a member of this Church or any other church to receive Holy Communion at / or with Ray Of Hope Church.

This Holy Communion is the Table of Jesus Christ, who is present among us. Jesus invites you to receive Him in this Eucharistic banquet. If this is your first time receiving The Blessed Sacrament, let us know before you receive it, or right after so we might pray a special prayer of thanksgiving with you.

Unfortunately, through the centuries, many institutional churches have established rules, teachings, and practices that exclude people from Holy Communion. There has been an almost endless list of reasons to exclude people from the Blessed Sacrament. Yet, together, during the worship service, we recite the very words of Jesus, the Words of Institution, "This is my body. This is my blood," and we rehear Christ present with us saying: "Take this, all of you and eat; Take this all of you and drink" of this gift.

After extensive consideration, I take these words, "Take this, all of you.." as a command to the Church to give and bring the Eucharistic Gift to everyone who will receive. This approach also requires us to educate people about this gift. I have said it is **uniquely and deliberately the work of Christ in His Church** to offer the necessary education, guidance, and practices that help people live a life centered and purposed on finding and sharing the Will of God. The Lord's Table is central to that life.

The Eucharist belongs to the Church. The Blessed Sacrament is Christ in, through, with us, and made known in breaking the Bread of Life and drinking the Cup of Salvation. We are to take this gift 9-24-23 Semi-Annual Meeting. Year A Page 39 of 41 to the whole World.

We begin by inviting those on the fringe of Society, those pushed aside, poor, not accepted, sick, and who need God's help in extraordinary ways.

We welcome and bring the Eucharist to everyone told they cannot receive it by other Denominations. In conclusion, to everyone told "no, you cannot" go to Communion in any other church; hear us, "yes, you can" at Ray Of Hope. All are welcome. Or, as we like to say as one of our mottos when we quote Fr. Bartholomew J. O'Brien, "You are as welcome here as Christ Himself."
