Peter's Declaration about Jesus

²⁷ Jesus went on with his disciples to the villages of Caesarea Philippi; and on the way he asked his disciples, "Who do people say that I am?" ²⁸ And they answered him, "John the Baptist; and others, Elijah; and still others, one of the prophets." ²⁹ He asked them, "But who do you say that I am?" Peter answered him, "You are the Messiah." ³⁰ And he sternly ordered them not to tell anyone about him.

Jesus Foretells His Death and Resurrection

³¹ Then he began to teach them that the Son of Man must undergo great suffering, and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and after three days rise again. ³² He said all this quite openly. And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. ³³ But turning and looking at his disciples, he rebuked Peter and said, "Get behind me, Satan! For you are setting your mind not on divine things but on human things."

Reader: This is the Gospel of the Lord. ALL: Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ. Sermon Notes: Br. Shawn Benedict, Pastor. Worship is our primary activity as a church. There is an old standard in the church, lex orandi, lex credendi which means that "the law of prayer is the law of faith" or "that which we pray is that which we believe." Our prayer, our worship is the key to understanding what God has revealed for us to accept as true. This set of readings has been missed in recent years because we usually change this Sunday to the normal readings for the Feast of the Triumph of the Cross. This set does rise to the occasion, though. In the first reading we have the voice of Jesus in the hours of the trial before Pilate, King Herod, back to Pilate and in the hands of the guards. We also hear the voices of all who have gone before us making a place for he church in the world by their personal sacrifices. Without those sacrifices the church would not survive in the world which is against the message of the church. The Psalm speaks of being in the justice of the Cross and living in it. The second reading continues the discussion of faith plus works. As we meet today as congregation we celebrate that this has not only been a religious faith organization, but our faith has led us to many works for the Gospel. Ray Of Hope has always been a faith plus works church. Notice in this Gospel it is all about acknowledging who Jesus is. This is the primary message of Ray Of Hope Church, who Jesus is and why this is so important for ALL people of every sexual orientation and every gender expression, even as we continue to discover more of both of them. (Notice no "build my church" in this Gospel) "Those who are ashamed..." We are not ashamed, and this is why we are here. Our message is clear and set out perfectly in our Statement Of Purpose and all through our web site. This is why we have a public building and a public ministry of services.
