WE GATHER TO PRAISE THE LORD AND TO GIVE THANKS

+ Pastoral Welcome

Kaiden Rae Benedict : Good morning. We welcome you to Ray Of Hope Church Of Our Lord Jesus Christ, the faith community founded in Central New York, and now all across the world through the Internet, where everyone is welcome. We extend a special welcome to our visitors and guests. We invite you to participate in this worship event as you feel comfortable and we are glad you have chosen to spend this time with us.

Moderator Veronica Floyd: We welcome The Reverend Leanne Zeck to our worship event today as our guest Celebrant and Preacher. Rev. Zeck serves as a Chairperson in her United Methodist Church district's leadership and is the Pastor of the Centenary United Methodist Church in Bath, NY. When she was the Pastor at New Beginnings United Methodist Church here in Elmira, she was a very enthusiastic participant in all things ecumenical. We all were enriched by her time in our area. Rev. Zeck is a friend of Ray Of Hope Church. She has shared in our Holy Week Services and even helped with Pastoral Leadership at the Resurrection Vigil on March 26, 2016. Brother has this to say about Rev. Zeck: "I, Br. Benedict, consider Pastor Zeck to be a very dear friend, someone I can share my deepest spiritual

thoughts with, and someone I can relate to as she works for equality throughout the Christian Church. When I asked her to help me with this paragraph, she asked me to add: 'I have found sanctuary and hope in worshiping with Ray Of Hope Church and in our friendship.'" Kaiden Rae Benedict: You are as welcome here as Christ Jesus himself. In Romans Chapter 15:7 the church is commanded:

Pastor Zeck: Grace, peace, and fellowship be with you from God, our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, and the Holy Spirit. (1 Corinthians 1:3, 2 Corinthians 13:14, 2 Peter 1:2-4)

ALL: And also with you.

Veronica Floyd: Today is Father's Day when we celebrate the ministry of parenting and fathering at Ray of Hope. God is the ultimate example of love that a parent has for their children and it is that love of God that we share and enjoy. Today is the third Sunday of Pride Month and we give God thanks and praise for the rainbow, a symbol to reflect the diversity of the LGBTQSIA2SS+ community and a sign of the covenant established between GOD and all life on earth. It is also the

25th anniversary of Ordination and the Solemn Profession of Benedictine Vows for Br. Benedict. All the scripture verses today are the same ones presented at the 1996 ordination service and much of today's music was co-authored or written by Br. Benedict. It is truly a day of celebration and gratitude. Again, we are so blessed and happy to have Pastor Leanne Zeck from Centenary United Methodist Church participating with us today.

Pastor Zeck: We begin now to worship God in the beauty of holiness, in spirit, and in truth. (Psalm 96:9; John 4:23-24)

ALL: Together we give God thanks and praise.

+ The Candle Of Hope

Kaiden Rae Benedict: Please be seated. At this time we light our Resurrection Candle Of Hope. This is a testimony to our anticipation of the resurrection of all the dead, and the transformation of the living faithful, when Christ returns.

ALL: Jesus said: "I am the resurrection and the life. Those who believe in me, even though they die, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die." (John 11:25, 26)

Kaiden Rae Benedict: Our faith community is looking forward and waiting "for the blessed hope and the manifestation of the glory of our great God and Saviour, Jesus Christ." (Titus2:13 NRSV) We named this candle the Candle of Hope in honor of the "Blessed Hope," the return of Christ who will raise all to new life. (John 5:25)

Frank Ward: It is our custom to read panel entries from the Names Project Aids Memorial Quilt to help us remember those who died of AIDS, especially since many who were very sick and dying were rejected by the churches, were very much alone, and needed spiritual guidance. We remember them here and pray for their families.

Frank Ward: We also remember in our hearts the names of our family and friends who have passed. May the candle's flame remind us of the joy and happiness known in life, the comfort offered us by the Holy Spirit in our loss, and the "Blessed Hope" we have in the resurrection of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ.

Whitney Tipton: We pray together:

I declare in the midst of this assembly of believers that I am truly sorry for having offended God in any way. Veronica Floyd: Almighty and Eternal God, creator of the Heavens and Earth, it is in your image that we all are created. In God's eyes we are all wonderfully and uniquely made. We pray that we see and recognize you, God, in all people we encounter daily and give you thanks and praise. Lord, have mercy.

ALL: Lord, have mercy.

Cheryl Allen: Christ Jesus, Wonderful Counselor, Prince of Peace, Forgiver of sins, you are with us at all times. Help us to imitate your love and be kind, tenderhearted, forgiving one another as God in Christ has forgiven us. Christ, have mercy.

ALL: Christ, have mercy.

Kaiden Benedict: Holy Spirit, you are with us as the Helper, the Comforter, our Advocate, our Intercessor, our Counselor, our Strengthener, the one who will always stand by us. Help us to see these gifts as ways we can show forth God's gift of Fatherhood to those who need it most. Lord, have mercy.

ALL: Lord, have mercy.

Pastor Zeck: May Almighty God have mercy on all of us, forgive all our sins, and keep us in everlasting life.

ALL: Amen.

Pastor Zeck: Please rise as you are able to give thanks and praise to God for the forgiveness of our sins by praying the Gloria.

THE SERVICE OF THE WORD OF GOD

+ First Reading

Michael Quinnell: The first reading is in the Book of Ezekiel, chapter 34, verses 1-10 which may be found on page 803 in the back of the NRSV Bible. Here begins the reading:

34 The word of the LORD came to me: ² Mortal, prophesy against the shepherds of Israel: prophesy, and say to them—to the shepherds: Thus says the Lord GOD: Ah, you shepherds of Israel who have been feeding yourselves! Should not shepherds feed the sheep? ³ You eat the fat, you clothe yourselves with the wool, you slaughter the fatlings; but you do not feed the sheep. ⁴ You have not strengthened the weak, you have not healed the sick, you have not bound up the injured, you have not brought back the strayed, you have not sought the lost, but with force and harshness you have ruled them. ⁵ So they were scattered, because there was no shepherd; and scattered, they became food for all the wild animals. ⁶ My sheep were scattered, they wandered over all the mountains and on every high hill; my sheep were scattered over all the face of the earth, with no one to search or seek for them.

⁷ Therefore, you shepherds, hear the word of the LORD: ⁸ As I live, says the Lord GOD, because my sheep have become a prey, and my sheep have become food for all the wild animals, since there was no shepherd; and because my shepherds have not searched for my sheep, but the shepherds have fed themselves, and have not fed my sheep; ⁹ therefore, you shepherds, hear the word of the LORD: ¹⁰ Thus says the Lord GOD, I am against the shepherds; and I will demand my sheep at their hand, and put a stop to their feeding the sheep; no longer shall the shepherds feed themselves. I will rescue my sheep from their mouths, so that they may not be food for them.

Lisa Frost: The second reading is in the Book of the First Letter of Saint Peter chapter 5, verses 1-5, found on page 235 in the second testament, in the back of the NRSV Bible. At the Rite of Ordination in 1996, this scripture was presented by my mother Martha Cummings,

who is a foundress of the Southern Tier Extension and entered Paradise on February 15, 2014. Here begins the reading:

Tending the Flock of God

5 Now as an elder myself and a witness of the sufferings of Christ, as well as one who shares in the glory to be revealed, I exhort the elders among you ²to tend the flock of God that is in your charge, exercising the oversight, not under compulsion but willingly, as God would have you do it—not for sordid gain but eagerly. ³Do not lord it over those in your charge, but be examples to the flock. ⁴And when the chief shepherd appears, you will win the crown of glory that never fades away. ⁵In the same way, you who are younger must accept the authority of the elders. And all of you must clothe yourselves with humility in your dealings with one another, for

RENEWAL OF VOWS

Veronica Floyd: At this time I would like to ask Br. Benedict to come forward for the renewal of his Vows.

Frank Ward: Twenty-five years ago we witnessed your promises to God and this Congregation to serve us. We accepted your spoken word that you would give your all to these commitments. Today, we invite you to renew your resolve and our partnership with you in Christ. With these renewed promises you make today we understand you are committing yourself to another twenty-five years of Religious Life according to God's will for you.

Veronica Floyd: To what do you renew your faithful commitment?

Br. I promise, to be faithful to God, to the Gospel of Christ, the ministry of the Holy Spirit, and this Congregation.

Whitney Tipton: What is your commitment to Sacred Scripture?

Br. I promise to faithfully teach the Sacred Scriptures as the literal revealed truth, the inspired Word of God. I will never hold another religious writing in higher esteem than the Bible.

Kaiden Rae Benedict: Who will you welcome to the Gospel of Christ?

Br. I promise to welcome and guide all people to God's free gift of salvation made known in Christ Jesus.

Michael Quinnell: What do you promise to teach regarding Jesus the Christ?

Br. I will always teach Jesus is the only Christ of God, the Only Begotten Son of God, eternally begotten of God, God from God, Light from Light, Very God from Very God, of one being with God, co-equal with God and the Holy Spirit, the only Saviour of Humanity, Lord of the living and the dead, Head of the Church, Chief Bishop of Souls, our personal Lord, and Saviour. Jesus is truly and actually present with us as He promised He would be until the end of the age. He is present in His Body, the Church, in each person, in creation itself, in the spoken and written Word, and the Sacraments of His Church. He is first in all things. All things were created through and for Him and in Jesus, all things consist and continue in being. Every knee in the Heavens, on the earth, and under the earth will bend and every tongue will proclaim Jesus Christ is Lord.

Lisa Frost: What do you promise regarding the Sacraments?

Br. I promise, to remain faithful to all of the Sacraments, those we understand now and those that may be revealed in our future. I will teach the Sacraments as those sacred moments when God expresses and manifests literal grace present in this world.

Cheryl Allen: You promised to be a Monk, a disciple, a student of St. Benedict and his sister St. Scholastica of Nursia, St. Francis and St. Clare of Assisi. You have personally experienced the intercessory prayers of Franciscan Sister St. Marianne Cope of Syracuse, NY, Beloved Mother of Outcasts. You have experienced the power of intercessory prayer from those in Paradise and those here on Earth. What do you promise in response to your lived experience in Religious Life in the 21st Century?

Br. I am filled with gratitude to Ray Of Hope Church and Fr. John J. McNeill, of the Society of Jesus, who is now in Paradise, for receiving my Benedictine Vows of Obedience, Stability, and Conversion of Life twenty-five years ago. Receiving and then living the name Shawn – Hebrew for God is gracious, Francis – for St. Francis who welcomed all people, and Benedict – for St. Benedict who taught and maintained congregational polity where all are equal in the church, has been humbling, to say the least. Every time I hear “Brother” or “Br. Benedict,” or “Br. Shawn,” I stand face-to-face with my failures, inadequacies, and weaknesses. However, I am committed to the effort of keeping Religious Life relevant in these times as the world grows more secular every day. I find the balance between established traditions such as the beautiful Benedictine habit, Divine Office, and being available to the unchurched modern culture, especially the LGBTQSIA2ss+ young culture is tough and a daily struggle. However, I love the challenge and I enthusiastically embrace twenty-five more years of these Vows with God’s help if it is God’s will. I remind everyone that Ray Of Hope Church is free at any time to no longer receive these Vows, dismiss the Vows, and send me on my way. The Vow of Stability (to remain in the community where Solemn Profession is made) is my commitment to you, not your being tethered to me. Looking forward, I like to say the first twenty-five years were spent on stabilization, survival, and sustainability. The second twenty-five years will be spent on growth to help Ray Of Hope thrive, train, and transplant this Congregation to new leadership. The

founders and foundresses successfully transferred the leadership to a new generation, us, and now we must do the same. I plan to fade into the Congregation and continue providing support to the new leadership. My goal is to leave the Congregation with new leadership, in good standing, and thriving.

Rev. Leanne Zeck: What is your commitment to the wider Body Of Christ, the Church Universal?

Br. I promise to maintain a solid commitment to working together with the Church wherever she is found. I will continue to work for that same Christian faith of ancient ecumenical consensus described by St. Vincent of Lerins in the fifth century as “what has been believed always, everywhere, and by all.” At the same time, I will bring the particular charisms of Ray Of Hope Church to the ecumenical table, sometimes stretching the boundaries of others teachings, but always providing the place where I can bring a freedom to other clergy members that they may only be able to enjoy when they are guests of Ray Of Hope. The highlight of this entire first twenty-five years has been those ecumenical experiences where all the local pastors have stood together at one Communion Table surrounded by representatives of our congregations for worship. Ray Of Hope has been a significant influence on those activities locally. I will continue to support these efforts.

With all of these intentions I ask for the guidance of the Holy Spirit, the Grace of God, and the direction of Jesus, Chief Bishop, and Shepherd of my Soul.

Everyone is welcome to pray out loud for themselves, for others with prayers of praise and thanksgiving, or whatever is on your heart.

Please keep the prayers brief so as many people as possible may participate in the given time. We invite you to speak your prayers loud enough so everyone may hear your prayer and join you in spirit and in truth. So, we begin with _____

Whitney Tipton: (when all prayers have been heard) Lord Jesus, we lift our spoken and unspoken prayers and we ask you to intercede for us as our High Priest at the right hand of God.

ALL: Amen

+ Offertory And Preparation of our at-home Holy Communion Altars/tables.

Lisa Frost: At this time we show our gratitude to God and our dedication to the Church of Jesus Christ, which is His Body present in the world, by offering our financial gifts and support for this ministry. Those in the chapel may use the offering plate, while those worshipping with us on the internet may go to our website and use the PayPal link or you may mail a check to Ray Of Hope Church, 380 W. First St. Elmira NY 14901. Please give what you can, but never give your last.

At the same time, we will prepare our Holy Communion Altars and Tables at home and in the chapel. Bring to your table at home some wine, or grape juice, a small piece of bread, a little bit of water in a side cup, and a side napkin. The ideal situation is you are celebrating with us during the live webcast. We do understand you may be viewing this video at another time. We do not encourage private practice and reception of Communion as your normal, weekly worship routine. Communion is a gift for the worship community to celebrate together,

an action of the local church. However, if this is an extraordinary situation, and you believe the Holy Spirit is calling you to celebrate at a time other than the live webcast, then yield to the direction of the Holy Spirit. Each of you in the chapel will find at your seat a small plate, communion wafer, plastic chalice of grape juice and a napkin. Please take the plate and wafer from the baggie and shake the chalice gently in case there has been settling of the contents. Please do not remove the top from the chalice until the Celebrant announces that Communion is served. Once you have received Communion, place the plastic chalice on top of the plate and someone will collect while the Table of the Lord is being cleared.

(* The offering is received. The Altar and Tables are set.)

Cheryl Allen: (*Pray a prayer over the offering giving thanks and praise.*) Please rise as you are able to conclude the Service Of The Word Of God with a doxology.

ALL: Praise God from whom all blessings flow. Praise God all creatures here below. Praise God above ye heavenly hosts. Praise God the Son and Holy Ghost. Amen



WE CELEBRATE THE SACRED MEAL OF CHRIST

Pastor Zeck: Lord God, we ask you to receive our worship this day. We pray that you will be pleased with our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving we offer you with humble and contrite hearts.

ALL: May the Lord accept our lives as a sacrifice for the praise and glory of God's name, for our good and the good of all God's people. Amen

Pastor Benedict: Please lift your bread at this time. Frank Ward will lead this prayer.

Frank Ward: Blessed are you, Lord, God of all creation. It is through your goodness that we have this bread, which the Earth has given us and human hands have lovingly made. Now, through the powerful ministry of the Holy Spirit, this bread will become for us the Bread From Heaven (Exodus 16:2, Psalm 78:24, John 6:32, 41,50,58), the Bread of the Angels (Psalm 78:25), the Bread of God (John 6:33), the Living Bread (John 6:51), the Bread Of Life (John 6:35, 48, 58), the Bread of the New Covenant (John 6:32, 49, 50,51, 58), the Sacrament of the Eucharist, the very Body Of Christ (John 6:52-56, 1Corinthians 10:16).

ALL: Blessed be God forever.

Pastor Benedict: Please set down your bread.

Now pour your wine or grape juice into your cup, if you have not done so already. Then add a small amount of water to the cup. With this water, we remember Jesus is human, and with this fruit of the vine we remember He is divine forever.

Now, please lift your cup together. Veronica Floyd will lead this prayer.

Veronica Floyd: Blessed are you, Lord, God of all creation. It is through your goodness that we have this fruit of the vine, which the Earth has given us and human hands have lovingly made. Now, through the powerful ministry of the Holy Spirit, this fruit of the vine will become for us the Cup of Our Salvation (Psalm 116:13), the Cup of Everlasting Life (John 6:54-57), the Cup of the New Covenant (Matthew 26:28, Luke 22:20, 1 Corinthians 11:25), the very Blood Of Christ (John 6:54-56; 1Corinthians 10:16).

ALL: Blessed be God forever.

Pastor Benedict: Please set down your cup.

Kaiden Rae Benedict: We offer ourselves, with our whole heart, our whole soul, and our whole mind unto you Almighty God. Accomplish your desires for us in our lives. Mold us to be more like you every day. Receive us along with these gifts of bread and fruit of the vine to be made holy, and through them make us into a perfect offering to you, One and Only Holy God. We ask this in the name of Jesus, Our Lord.
ALL: Amen.

Pastor Zeck: Truly present and risen among us, the Lord is with you!
ALL: And also with you!

Pastor Zeck: As His Body, we lift up our hearts!
ALL: We lift them up to the Lord!

Pastor Zeck: As His Church, we give thanks to the Lord, our God!
ALL: It is right to give God thanks and praise.

Pastor Benedict: It is right that we should give you thanks and praise always and everywhere through our Lord and Saviour, Christ Jesus.

He is the image of you the invisible God, He is the first-born over all creation. In Him, all things consist and have their being.

Christ has called us into this place, into his very Body, the Church. Christ continues to build His Church as He said He would, and be with us until the end of this Age.

We are grateful to celebrate Christ's Lordship over our lives and our deaths. In Christ, we have experienced the power of your love, Almighty God. Through that love, we are now able to join our voices with all the Beloved Community from every time and every place who have already passed through the valley of the shadow of death and are forever secure in your eternal presence. Accept our song as we join in their unending hymns of praise. + We Invoke the Blessing Of The Holy Spirit

Lisa Frost: Here at Ray Of Hope Church, everyone prays together to ask the Holy Spirit to give to us the exact same gifts that Jesus gave when He instituted Holy Communion for His Church. At this time, I invite you to extend your hands forward over the bread and fruit of the vine, or extend your arms out with palms turned up in prayer and say the following Invocation of the Holy Spirit together.

ALL: O God, in the Name of Jesus, we, your faithful people, ask your Only One and Holy Spirit to bless and separate this bread and fruit of the vine for Christ's purpose. Through the powerful ministry of the Holy Spirit, give to us the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ in precisely the exact same manner that He gave them, and

commissioned us to do often in His Holy Name. You alone, O Loving, True God, authenticate for us that this is the Messiah, Christ, New Covenant Meal that Jesus instituted for our Spiritual and physical well-being. We ask this in the Name of Jesus. Amen

+ The Words Of The Institution Of The Holy Eucharist

Pastor Benedict: Please lower your hands now. Please lift at this time the Eucharistic Body Of Christ, the Bread of Salvation and together we will say aloud our Lord and Saviour's words of institution when he gave us the Blessed Sacrament.

ALL: Before He was given up to death, a death He freely accepted, He took the bread and gave you thanks. He broke the bread, gave it to his disciples, and said:

Take this, all of you, and eat it: This is my body which will be given up for you. Do this in memory of me.

(pause for adoration**) (**you may bow or genuflect if you choose to**)**

Pastor Benedict: Please set down the Bread of Life. Please lift now, the cup of salvation. Now, for the cup we say aloud:

ALL: When the supper was ended, He took the cup. Again He gave you thanks and praise, gave the cup to His disciples, and said:

Take this, all of you, and drink from it: This is the cup of my blood, the blood of the new and everlasting covenant. It will be shed for you and for all so that sins may be forgiven. Do this in memory of me.

(pause for adoration**) (**you may bow or genuflect if you choose to**)**

Pastor Benedict: Please set down the Cup of Salvation.

+ A Proclamation Of Our Faith (To the tune of We Shall Overcome)

ALL: Jesus Christ has died for us, Christ our Lord is risen, Christ will come again someday. Oh deep in my heart, I do believe that Jesus Christ will come again.

+ Prayers of Dedication and/or Intercession for other Ministries.

Pastor Zeck: While we are gathered here together, we ask your blessing Almighty God on all religious leaders of every religion known to humanity. We pray that religious leaders everywhere would recognize and act upon their obligation to guide all people to you, God. We also pray that religious leaders will guide people to work for freedom and respect for everyone. We ask your blessing, Almighty God upon every community of seekers, and those with no faith or formal Religion.

We also pray for all people who have been driven from faith because of the sins of those who have misused religion to hurt others. We pray for those who have been cast aside, excommunicated, and wrongly not included. May all people everywhere come to the knowledge that they too are the living light of God. We eagerly await your promised renewal of all creation when you shall be all in all. (1 Corinthians 15:28)

+ Final Doxology

Pastor Benedict: Please elevate the Holy Eucharist as a gesture of praise, thanksgiving, honor, gratitude, and the offering of the entire Church, the Body Of Christ, to God.

ALL: AMEN

+ Invitation to the Lord's Table

Pastor Benedict: At this time I ask you to lift with me the Blessed Sacrament.

Pastor Benedict: Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world. Behold Jesus truly present in the Bread of Life, and the Cup of Salvation. Behold Him who said whoever eats of this Bread and drinks of this Cup though they die they shall live forever. (John 6:50, 51, 54) Blessed are those who come to His Table. All are welcome.

ALL: Lord, you make me worthy to receive you, and by your Word I am healed. (This prayer is credited to Fr. James Callan, Spiritus Christi of Rochester, NY.)

Pastor Benedict: Please set down the Bread and Cup at this time.

Pastor Zeck: I assure you, by the promises of Christ, that anyone who receives this Holy Communion today will surely live forever and be raised by Christ to new life.

PRIVATE PRAYER FOR A SPIRITUAL COMMUNION. Some people are watching from a location where they do not have actual Holy Communion Bread and Wine with them. We offer the following prayer for them based upon a prayer from the Episcopal National Cathedral Prayer book for a Spiritual reception of Holy Communion. This prayer assures all the benefits and blessings of a physical reception.

Oh, My Jesus, I believe that you are truly present in the Blessed Sacrament of the Altar. I love you above all things, and I welcome you in my soul. Since I cannot now receive you in the Sacrament of your Body and Blood, come spiritually into my heart. Cleanse and strengthen me with your grace, Lord Jesus, and let me never be separated from you. May I live in you, and you in me, in this life and the life to come. Amen.

Spiritual Communion Prayer from the Episcopal National Cathedral Prayer Book.

A spiritual communion is a personal devotional that anyone can pray at any time to express their desire to receive Holy Communion at that moment, but in which circumstances impede them from actually receiving Holy Communion.

Pastor Benedict: Communion is now served. Everyone is invited to receive Holy Communion at Ray Of Hope Church. It is not required that you be a member of this church or any other church to receive Holy Communion. This is the Table of Jesus Christ, He invites you to come and receive Him in this Eucharistic banquet
